President Eisenhower was quoted as follows: "Every American who joins this Crusade for the support of Radio Free Europe can be sure in his heart of these things:

1. He is supporting the cause of peace throughout the world.
2. He is helping arm the spirits of captive people with hope and courage.
3. He is helping to keep Central and Eastern Europeans strong, determined to win their own way back to freedom.

I urge every American to support this independent American enterprise dedicated to strengthening the will-to-freedom." A
