Blessed Mother Held Model For All Womanhood

Auburn — "Womanhood and Our Blessed Lady" was the subject of the talk given by the Rev. John B. Kleintjes at the Auburn First Saturday Luncheon Feb. 6 at the Osborne Hotel.

The speaker, after tracing the varying degrees of respect accorded women through the ages, declared that the present Pontiff, Pius XII has ever worked to "rebuild and restore the rightful dignity of women while pointing to the Blessed Virgin Mary as the model for all womanhood."

As a practical suggestion Father Kleintjes urged the daily recitation of the "Memorare" as a special act of devotion during the Marian Year.

Presiding was Mrs. John C. O'Toole who called attention to the shrine which was prepared under the direction of Mrs. Frank L. Doyle.
