Son of Marcus and Gertrude Schmidt Krauter of 138 Dalkoth Road, the young man will be in-  
ordained in and for the ser-

vice of the Diocese of Steubenville, Ohio, by Bishop John K. Musso of that diocese. Ordination will take place in St. Isadore's Chapel of St. John Vianney Minor Seminary, Bloomingdale, Ohio on Saturday, March 13 at 10:30 p.m.

Sponsor at the ordination will be the Rev. Bernard Dolan, assistant pastor, Holy Rosary, Rochester.

Sgt. Leonard attended St. Mary's School in Elizabeth, Nazareth Academy in Rochester, and first entered the Wac in February, 1950. She received her basic training at the Wac Center, Fort Lee, Va.

During her tour of duty in the United States, Sgt. Leonard has served at Fort Lawton, Wash., as a typist and file clerk and while in Yokohama she was a member of the Cadre at Detachment A, of the WAC Unit.

Sgt. Leonard reported for duty with headquarters and Headquarters Company on Feb. 1, 1954 and has been assigned as Sergeant Major of Headquarters Command.
