### 'Junior Week' To Mark 28th Anniversary Of Junior CDA

The 28th Anniversary of the founding of the Junior Catholic Daughters of America organization will be celebrated throughout the country next week—JUNIOR WEEK—

from Feb. 21 to 27 according to Miss Frances M. Maher, Supreme Regent, Catholic Daughters of America, sponsors of the Junior Youth Program for girls from 12 to 18 years of age.

The Anniversary will be marked in local Junior Courts by a three-fold celebration of spiritual, charitable and recreational activities.

On Junior Day, Feb. 22, Masses will be offered by local Junior Chaplains for the intentions of the Holy Father at which Counsellors and Juniors will offer up the Masses for him with a Priest, as well as their Holy Communions.

These Masses will be followed during the week by a re-dedication of Juniors to the Sacred Heart, Communion Breakfasts, Initiations of new members, Pilgrimages to Marian Shrines where possible, charitable projects, Radio Broadcasts and special Anniversary Social activities.

The Annual Campaign for the Holy Father's Charities will close on Junior Day. Counsellors and Juniors have been saving one cent a week each for the past 25 weeks. The amount collected from this Campaign together with the Junior Day Spiritual Bouquet will be forwarded to the Holy Father to reach him for Easter.

The promotion of the SDS (Supply the Demand for the Supply) Crusade—has been named a special National project for the current Junior Year. During Junior Week Radio Broadcasts explaining the origin of the Crusade, its standards and methods of promotion, will be presented by Juniors over local Radio stations.

In localities where Radio time is not available Mock Broadcasts on the SDS Crusade will be given for parents of Juniors, Senior C.D.A. members and parish organizations with a view to forming a united front in really doing something to bring about a return to Christian principles of modesty and decency in dress and an appreciation of what it means to "Dare to Be Different" (one of the Junior Ideals) in this respect in their communities.

Juniors are now organized in 75 Dioceses of the United States, Puerto Rico and Alaska. A Semi-annual report of the growth and activities of the organization will be given by Miss Beatrice M. Hoffman, National Director, at the Supreme Directorate Meeting of the C.D.A. in New Orleans, on Feb. 20.

Rev. Msgr. John S. Middleton, P.A., Pastor of St. Peter's Church, Barclay Street, New York City and formerly Secretary of Education to His Eminence Cardinal Spellman, is National Chaplain of the Junior C.D.A. and will attend the meeting in New Orleans.
