### \$1,725,000 Hall Now Being Built At St. Bona U.

St. Bonaventure, N. Y. — Construction of a \$1,725,000 residence hall has been started at St. Bonaventure University.

Expected to be completed by November of this year, the new 500-student dormitory will mark the second step in the \$3,725,000 building and expansion program announced for St. Bonaventure three years ago.

First building to be erected under the program was the \$2,500,000 Christ the King Seminary, dedicated last November. Additional buildings included in the program are a faculty house, a science building, and a student union.

CONTRACTS FOR the new dormitory were approved by the Federal Housing and Home Finance Agency and let to four firms. They are the Clemmer Construction Co. of Akron, O., general contractor; Robert Finlay Co. of Olean, heating; James Monaco Co. of Buffalo, plumbing; and to Cortright Co. of Ithaca, electrical.

The new dormitory will be of modern design. It will consist of two three-story T-shape wings for housing. These wings, opposite each other, will be connected by a lobby, lounge, and recreation wing. This wing will be 100 feet across and 48 feet deep and have thermopane glass walls 18 feet high to ceiling opening onto outdoor courts for additional recreation space.

The new residence hall is the first permanent housing unit to be built on the campus since the erection of Devereux Hall which was completed in the late 1920s.

### Louis Huybrechts Named Organist At Cathedral

Mr. Vernon McArdle, organist at Sacred Heart Cathedral, has left for his hometown in Elkhart, Indiana to fill a similar position as organist. He has been succeeded by Mr. Louis Huybrechts of Buffalo.

A native of Belgium, Mr. Huybrechts is a graduate of the Institute of Liturgical Music at Malines, Belgium where he was a pupil of the celebrated organist, Flor Peeters.

DURING HIS six years' attendance at the Institute in Malines, his course of studies included Gregorian chant, harmony, counterpoint, fugue, composition, choir directing, piano and organ. He was graduated with the highest honors and awarded the coveted Lemmens-Triel.

Organist, pianist, composer, Mr. Huybrechts also studied at the Royal Conservatory of Music at Antwerp and holds a diploma in piano from that institution. He has frequently appeared as soloist on the piano and organ on radio and concert programs and has performed in concerts in the principal cities of Belgium, in Luxembourg and London.

In addition to his regular duties, Mr. Huybrechts will furnish organ music during the last four Masses each Sunday.
