Father Norris Talk Opens Auburn Pre-Cana Course

Auburn—The Rev. John P. Norris, assistant pastor of St. Charles Borromeo Church, Rochester, will be the opening speaker at the Seventh Annual Marriage Preparation Course, sponsored by the Committee on Family and Parent Education of Auburn Council, Diocesan Council of Catholic Women.

THE OPENING talk, "True Values for Marriage," will be given Monday, March 8 at 8:15 p.m. in the Knights of Columbus Home on Geneva Street. Four subsequent meetings will be held on the following Monday nights and will include talks by priest, layman on subjects pertinent to the sacrament of matrimony.

Mrs. Frank L. Doyle, chairman of the Family and Parent Education committee, pointed out that the course "is designed not only for the engaged man and woman, who are planning a Catholic marriage. It is strongly urged, therefore, that both attend the lectures together, but when this is impossible, either is most welcome to attend. While not specifically intended for married people, the course is open to those married people who may wish to attend.

"Engaged couples should remember that this course is intended not to supplant but rather to supplement the required marriage instructions given by the pastor."

Hatred Has No Place In Irish Heart, AOH Told

Auburn—The fourth annual Communion breakfast of the Ancient Order of Hibernians and their Auxiliary took place Sunday, Feb. 21. After having attended the 8 p.m. Mass at Holy Family Church, the group assembled at the Osborne Hotel. The Rev. Kieran J. Hickey, O. Carm., the speaker, said in part: "There is no place in the Irish heart. The feelings which our fathers passed on to us was described simply but adequately by poet Tom Moore:

"A type that breeds

Love, valor, and heaven,

Freedom of God's country, of freedom of Christ's Church, the courage of our convictions and the readiness to stand up and to be counted for the things in which we believe—the eternal sense of humor that characterized our fathers even in their poorest and darkest hours! If these virtues, it is because the Hope and the Faith of which these are born are less alive in us than they were in those who preserved them for us.

"IT IS TRAGIC," said Father Hickey, "that the noblest deeds of Irish culture and the beauty of the Irish character are so often displaced by vulgar caricatures. Tragic," he continued, "because these things were passed on to us through seven long centuries of persecution, famine and oppression."

Joseph P. Cuddy was toastmaster. Brief greetings were extended by John Griffin, president of the organization, and by Miss Elizabeth Russell, president of the Auxiliary. John Madden was general chairman of the breakfast.
