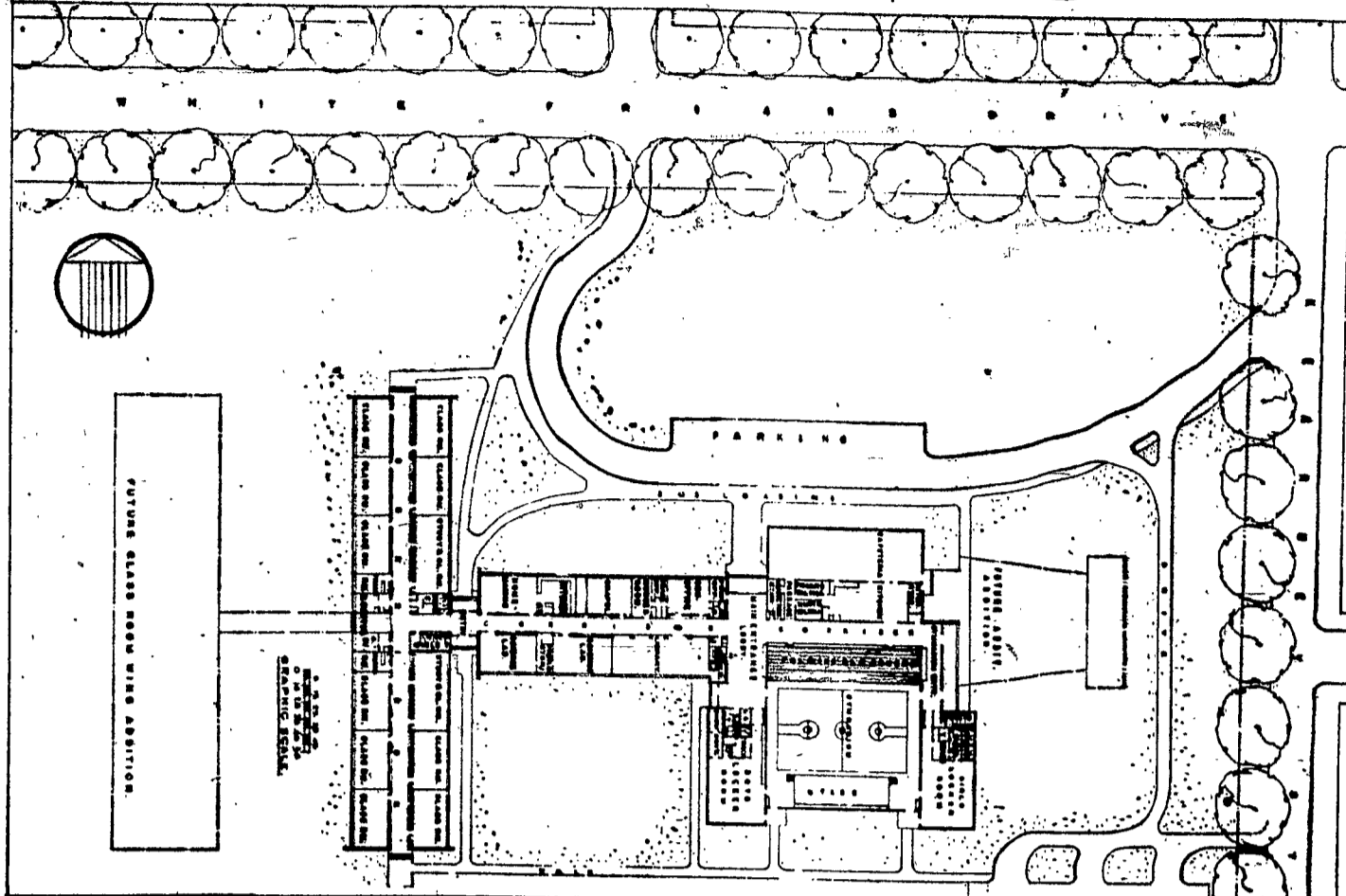


Auburn Architects' Plans For High School Bishop To Sing St. Patrick Feast Mass, Dedicate Plaque Marking First Church

Carmelite Fathers Await Bids On New High School

Auburn — The Carmelite Fathers have just authorized Beardsley and Beardsley, Architects to obtain bids on the proposed new Mount Carmel High School at the earliest possible date.

Separate bids will be received in a manner similar to that of public bidding, including separate bids for General Construction, Plumbing, Heating and Ventilating and Electric.

It is anticipated that many local contractors will be interested in the project, and that bids will be received within the current budget amounts so that work may proceed at an early date. Plans will be available from the architects' office within a very few days, and bids will be received early in April.

THE DRAWING printed above illustrates certain features of the building and the general floor plan not previously published for newspaper readers.

The gymnasium and cafeteria areas will be located on the east portion of the school with such classrooms as libraries, science rooms, offices located in the central portion and the classroom wing on the right. The building will be fully fireproof. In a special appeal read recently in the Catholic churches of Auburn, Bishop James E. Kearney stressed the importance of bringing pledges payments up to date and thanked all who, by honoring their pledges, enabled the work to proceed.

It is anticipated that construction of the school during this year may encourage the development of the entire residential district in the southern portion of the city.
