'Guadaleanal Padre', Ross To Watch Mission Bouts

The Rev. Frederick P. Gehring, C.M., famed as the "Guadaleanal Padre" of World War 2 will view the finals of Aquinas Mission Bouts at Edgerton Park Sports Arena with his friend Barney Ross, former lightweight and welterweight champion of the world on April 1.

This was announced at Aquinas Institute, this week where it was said the program for the Mission Bouts will feature 11 champion fights and dedication of the "King Mahoney Memorial Ring."

BARNEY ROSS met Father Gehring who later served as Navy Chaplain at Sampson Navy Station, while in the U.S. Marine Corps in World War 2. Ross won the Silver Star for gallantry in action.

Born in New York City on Dec. 23, 1908, he later moved with his family to Chicago when three years of age. Barney turned to boxing as a means of earning money to help support his mother and to get his four brothers and a sister out of an orphanage. His father was killed in 1923.

In 1933, Barney defeated Tony Canzoneri for the lightweight title, then next year Baby Face Jimmy McLarnin for the welter crown.

He gained nationwide publicity again when he conquered the drug habit.

Father Gehring is a member of the Congregation of the Mission, also known as the Vincentian Fathers who operate Niagara University.

Aquinas To Hail Cage Winners

A basketball team that has broken almost every record in the Aquinas Institute books will be honored at a special assembly of the school, next Wednesday.

To be cited are Ron Mack's 44 points in one game which still stands as a record. Never before has an unbeaten record been attained. Consecutive victories have now run to the 27 mark. No team in Aquinas history ever scored 1,000 points. The 1954 team scored 1,289. That is an average of 72 points per game. Their opponents scored an average of 44 points.

Three team members scored more than 200 points. Greg Britz led the group, with 300. Dan O'Brien, 269 and Fred Wagner, 245.

Wagner has been successful in 55 percent of his shots, having sunk 99 baskets out of 181 at tempo. Wagner also has been best at the foul line with an average of 88 percent. Britz had 56 percent and O'Brien, 66 percent. Mike Spang averaged 87 percent of his fouls.

Besides the assembly, many honors are being bestowed on the record-breaking team. The Rochester Ad Club feted them at a luncheon at the Powers Hotel. Lou Basile, coach, introduced the players. The Rev. John H. O'Loane, C.S.B., principal and the Rev. Cyril Carter, C.S.B., director of athletics were also guests at the head table.

The race in the St. Charles Holy Name Society League will make little closer after Friday's bowling with only 13 points now separating the first six teams.


