Father Sharon described marriage as a contract of adherence for which God alone lays down the rules to which the partners in marriage consent.

The object of marriage, he said, was answered in the Garden of Eden, that (1) it was not good for man to be alone, and (2) that he should procreate and fill the earth.

The talk was followed by a question period. Pamphlets, books and brochures were available for those interested.

Next conference, slated for Monday evening, March 15, will be given by the Rev. Louis J. Hohman. Subject of his talk will be "The Marriage Law."
