DCCW Lunch Group Told Of Apparition Of Knock

Auburn—The Apparition and Devotion of Knock was the topic of the First-Saturday Luncheon talk given by the Rev. Kieran J. Hickey, O. Carm., Saturday, March 6, at the Osborne Hotel, Auburn. Mrs. Louise W. Merna an officer of Court Auburn, Catholic Daughters of America, presided at the luncheon which was under the auspices of Auburn Deaneary, Diocesan Council of Catholic Women.
Reminding his hearers that devotion to Our Lady of Knock is not nationalistic, Father Hickey recalled the admonition of St. Patrick to his Irish converts, "As you are Irish, be you also Roman."
The speaker pointed out that the apparition at Knock occurred on August 21, 1871 in one of the darkest periods of Irish history when three famines, evictions, poverty, and the suppression of churches and schools had made life not merely hard but practically impossible for the Catholic Irish.
"There was nothing beautiful in Knock," declared Father Hickey, "but the souls of the people purified by suffering and sacrifice."

Gold Keys Given 28 Members Of Bellarmine Club

Geneva—Twenty-eight top students of De Sales High School have been awarded distinctive gold keys of the Bellarmine Club.
This recognition of their scholastic achievement was made by the Rev. Dr. Joseph L. Hogan, principal, in an awards assembly this week.
The keys are an innovation this year at De Sales. They will be awarded each quarter to the members of the Bellarmine Club.
TO ATTAIN membership in the club, a student must have an average of over 90 percent, and no mark under 75 percent. The key may be kept as long as these conditions are met.
They will be forfeited if in the following quarters, the average is below 90 percent. At graduation exercises, permanent possession of the key will be awarded to seniors who have remained on the Bellarmine list for at least twelve of their sixteen quarters.
The key is in the form of a scroll with the school seal and the words "Bellarmine Club engraved upon it."
BEFORE PRESENTING the keys, Doctor Hogan sketched the life of St. Robert Bellarmine for whom the club is named. He was a renowned Italian cardinal and theologian of the 16th Century. Pope Pius XI canonized him in 1930 as a model of Christian virtue and scholarship.

Priest Tells Luncheon Unit Of Assumption Dogma Rite

Geneva—There were 700,000 persons present in the basilica outside of the Vatican in Rome, Italy, for the proclamation of the Dogma of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into heaven.
An eye witness account of this extraordinary happening was told to 60 women at the "First Saturday" luncheon of the Geneva Deaneary, National Council of Catholic Women, Saturday in Hotel Seneca.
Rev. Dr. Joseph L. Hogan of St. Stephen's Church and principal of De Sales High School, was an eye witness to this spectacular event on Nov. 1, 1950, when Pope Pius XII proclaimed as a divinely revealed dogma of faith, that the Mother of God was assumed, body and soul into heaven.
Doctor Hogan described the day as a particularly beautiful one. The blue of the Italian sky was "like the blue of the mantle of the Blessed Virgin and the sun shone as though God smiled His approval," he said.
The Feast of the Assumption was celebrated in Jerusalem as early as the year 400, he said, and was the result of long standing tradition and belief.
The speaker stressed that it was fitting that God should preserve His mother from the corruption of the grave and as a gratitude of a loving Son for His Mother.
Why did the Church wait until 1950 to proclaim it? Doctor Hogan explained that years before the Pope wrote letters to all of the Bishops asking what they thought of it, and they unanimously agreed that the time is now.
Why was it proclaimed at this time? Perhaps, he said, it was to "lift our minds and hearts to heaven, when the world makes such demands upon us. To give the world at this special time a model of purity by focusing attention upon the Mother of God."
"Throughout our lives we should have special devotion to Our Blessed Mother," he advised.
The speaker concluded with
