Auburn Architects' Plans For High School 450 Elmirans At Rally Opening Drive To Rid Stands of Objectionable Readina

A determined campaign to rid the Elmira area of the highly objectional literature now appearing on newsstands was inaugarated in Elmira last Sunday night when nearly 450 members of the Elmira Deanery Council of Holy Name Societies, the Elmira Deanery Council of the National Council of Catholic Women and the Knights of Co. lumbus, attended a rally at St. Mary's auditorium.

Plans for the campaign were outlined by Rev. Albert V. Ryan, moderator of Elmira Deanery Council, NCCW and program, chairman. Father Ryan said that between 90 and 100 retailers would be contacted by teams and asked not to display literature classified as objectionable. Retail handlers of magazines in Elmira, Elmira Heights and Horseheads were contacted starting Monday in the start of a concerted effort to rid the stands of

the objectionable literature. Teams of men will contact the dealers the first three days of this week and their work will be followed up immediately by representatives of the women's groups. The men's group will report tonight to Daniel F. Kennedy and the women's group will


