Lou Balle, coach of Aquinas basketball team, Cyril Carter, C.S.B., Director of Athletics at Aquinas, Awards will be given at the banquet. The Bishop Keatney Trophy awarded to high school winners and the Bishop Casey Trophy awarded to grammar school winners.
In addition Miss Pat Parrish, tournament secretary will be in charge of cheerleaders award given to outstanding cheering squad in memory of Antonette Perdicci and Regina Hoffman former cheerleaders from St. Patrick's parish in Seneca Falls who perished in a fire two years ago.

Aquinas Slates 8 Football Games
With Boys Town, the only team to be defeated by Aquinas Institute last year, returning, the 1954 schedule for the Dewey Ave. high school football squad is announced by the Rev. Cyril Carter, C.S.B., director of athletics.
Aquinas nosed out Boys Town of Nebraska 13 to 12, and the famed team from the middle west will come for a traditional Thanksgiving Day date at Aquinas Memorial Stadium on Nov. 25.
St. Peter's High of Jersey City will return to the Memorial Stadium with a 1953 record of 8-2. Notre Dame High School of Chattanooga, Tenn. will be seen for the first time here and will be coached by Tom Seaman, former star at Aquinas and later at Notre Dame.
Opening game will be with North Catholic High School of Pittsburgh, winners of the Thanksgiving Day battle with Aquinas, 14 to 13, last year.
When Stan Zaidel, newly appointed head football coach at Aquinas was told of the schedule he expressed surprise at the variety and caliber of the teams which accepted the task as a great challenge. He expects to spend most of the summer with the Pittsburgh Steelers' coaches to prepare himself for the job ahead.
