### FAMILY CONSECRATION

Message of the Sacred Heart

Some time ago, I received a letter berating me for views expressed in the Messenger about the sanctity of marriage. A priest, being a celibate, can have no idea of what marriage is like, and, according to the letter, for some it is a pretty vicious thing. But a priest knows, perhaps better than any other, what God intended marriage to be. Christ instituted it as a Sacrament for the purpose of sanctifying men and women in a very special way. It was the celibate, Paul, who told us some important things about marriage. Marriage, being a Sacrament, is a sign of something. It is a sign of the union between Christ and his Church. (My correspondent objected to this idea as being sacrilegious.)

IN THE EPISTLE to the Ephesians, we read: "Let wives be subject to their husbands as to the Lord, because a husband is head of the wife, just as Christ is head of the Church, being Himself Saviour of the Body... Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ also loved the Church, and delivered Himself up for her, that He might sanctify her..." Commenting on these words, St. John Chrysostom called the family a little Church. Just as the purpose of the union between Christ and the Church is to sanctify her, so too, in this little Church, the sacramental purpose of the union is that each member of the family sanctify the other, that each make it easier and safer for the other to get to God. For this, Our Lord gives to each family the graces of the Sacrament. We can say, then, that God means each Christian family to be apostolic. Just as an individual in his own way, just as the Church in its greater way, must

## Sign Language Sermon 'Preached' At First Mass

Litchfield, Conn.—(NC)—When newly ordained Father Patrick Gaffney, S.M.M., offered his first Mass in the Chapel of St. Louis de Montfort Seminary here, the sermon was given in the sign language. Bleuch of St. Stanislaus Church in Bristol. In addition to Father Gaffney, two others of Mr. and Mrs. Gaffney's eight living children are in the religious life. They are Sister Rosemary of Norfolk, Va., and Sister James of Madawaska, Me., both Daughters of Wisdom nuns.
