### Bishop Casey Address Set By Friday Luncheon Club

First Friday Luncheon Club speaker on April 2 will be His Excellency, Auxiliary Bishop Casey, rector of Sacred Heart Cathedral according to the Rev. Raymond G. Hessel, chaplain of Rochester Council, Knights of Columbus and club moderator.

Bishop Casey will speak at the luncheon beginning at 12:15 p.m. in Hotel Sheraton.

A native of Rochester, Bishop Casey was ordained June 7, 1930 after completing his studies for the Holy Priesthood at St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminary.

HIS FIRST assignment was as assistant pastor of St. Mary's Church, Rochester. In October 1932 he became vice chancellor and secretary to the late Bishop John Francis O'Hara. He also served in that capacity under Archbishop Bishop Edward Mooney, now Cardinal Archbishop of Detroit.

His Excellency Bishop Kearney also named him in 1937 and he continued serving Bishop Kearney as secretary until 1946. During his years with Archbishop Mooney and Bishop Kearney he was also religious instructor at Our Lady of Mercy High School and Catholic chaplain at Monroe County Jail.

In February, 1946 he became pastor of Holy Cross Church and in that month accompanied

### Nocturnal Men's Breakfast To Attract 1,200

The unexpected large advance reservations for the annual Communion Breakfast of the Nocturnal Adoration Society on Sunday, April 4, has made a change necessary in the previously announced plans, according to William M. Mulcahy, the chairman in charge of arrangements.

Members will attend the Mass in the centers of their respective groups, Sacred Heart Cathedral, Blessed Sacrament, St. Andrew's and St. Monica's Churches, rather than at St. Joseph's Church as previously planned.

MORE THAN 1,200 members are expected to attend the Communion Breakfast which will be held at the Bausch and Lomb Cafeteria on St. Paul Street at 8:30 a.m. with His Excellency Bishop Kearney as speaker. This will be the largest Communion Breakfast ever held in Rochester.

The Rochester branch of the Nocturnal Adoration Society was organized at St. Patrick's Cathedral in 1928. This will be the first annual Communion Breakfast of the society since the formation of the four new centers of adoration in 1932 and 1933 at Blessed Sacrament Church, Sacred Heart Cathedral, St. Monica's and St. Andrew's Churches.

### Sacred Hearts Fathers To Give St. Boniface Mission

A three-week mission is underway at St. Boniface Church. The first week is for the children, the second for the women and the third week for the men.

The children will attend Mass each morning, at eight o'clock, followed by an instruction. In the afternoon there will be a study followed by instruction and Benediction of the most Blessed Sacrament.

THE WOMEN'S mission which will open Sunday evening, March 28 will consist of morning Mass and instruction, evening devotion consisting of Rosary, Benediction and Instruction. The Women's Mission will close Sunday afternoon at 3:00 with the renewal of Baptismal vows, imparting of the Papal Blessing and Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament. Masses will be at 6, 7:15 and 9 a.m.

The Men's Mission will open Sunday evening, April 4 at 7:15 p.m.

The Children's Mission is being conducted by Rev. Father James, S.S.C.C. of the Sacred Heart Fathers mission band whose headquarters is St. Matthew's Mt. Gilead, Ohio. Father James formerly taught in the preparatory seminary of the Congregation, served in parishes in New York, Brooklyn, and Mass., served in the missions of Hawaii and has been associate editor of the Congregation magazine, "The Preservation of the Home."

AS DIRECTOR of the Cause of Father Damien, S.S.C.C. for beatification, he has lectured extensively in the United States and Canada on the life of Father Damien, Apostle of the Sacred Hearts to the victims of leprosy on the Island of Molokai, Hawaii. As a member of the mission band Father James has preached retreats, novenas and missions in the United States and Canada.

Father Henry, S.S.C.C. a native of Fall River, Mass., presently attached to the National Headquarters of the Enthronement of the Sacred Heart, Washington, D. C. will join Father James in conducting the missions for the women and men.

Formerly assistant Novice-Master at Sacred Heart's Novitiate, Fairhaven, Mass., Father Henry has preached numerous retreats, missions and novenas throughout United States and Canada.

Although Father James preached the Holy Week Retreat at St. Boniface last year this is the first mission to be preached by the Fathers of the Sacred Heart in the Diocese of Rochester. The Fathers of the Sacred Heart who labor in 38 countries and foreign missions conduct the parish of
