St. Charles, St. Monica's Win Cage Tourney Titles

The 4th annual Diocesan Basketball tournament finished Sunday with tremendous success as announced by Howie Meath tournament chairman. St. Charles of Rochester merged victorious over a spirited but outplayed St. Francis team of Auburn by a score of 55-50 at Columbus Civic Center.

In the grammar school title game Don Garland's St. Monica's five topped defending champs Holy Redeemer by a score of 53-46.

In the consolation brackets St. Patrick's of Elmira defeated St. Casimir 54-42 for the high school consolation while St. Stephens of Geneva routed Sacred Heart 43-26 in the grammar school bracket.

THE TOURNAMENT is sponsored by Rochester Diocese jointly with Columbus Youth Association and Catholic Charities. More than 40 teams from the Rochester Diocese had entered with elimination rounds held Friday, Saturday and some Sunday morning to determine finalists in the afternoon championships.

Naturally the tournament banquet highlighted the gala affair with both winners and losers enjoying themselves to the utmost. Among many distinguished guests was His Excellency Bishop Kearney who presented the "Bishop Kearney" trophy to the high school champs St. Charles and the "Bishop Casey" trophy to the grammar school kings St. Monica's.

OTHER AWARDS were given to St. Stephens of Geneva and Immaculate Conception of Ithaca for cheerleading achievement along with a special award going to coach Lou Basile of Aquinas Institute on his great work guiding Aquinas to their first undefeated season.

Buffalo Game For Area Title Set For St. Monica's

Basketball champions of parochial school divisions in Buffalo and Rochester will meet for the Western New York Championship at St. Mary's School for the Deaf, 2253 Main St., Buffalo on Wednesday, March 31 at 4 p.m.

Meeting will be St. Monica's team, champions in the Rochester Catholic Diocese Basketball Tournament, and St. Mary's School for the Deaf, winners of the Parochial School Athletic Association pennant in Buffalo Diocese.

WINNER WILL be presented the "Monsignor Gerald C. Lambert Trophy," according to the Rev. John E. Gallagher, C.S.B., Chaplain for the Catholic Deaf in Buffalo and Rochester and the Rev. William F. White, assistant pastor of St. Monica's who made the arrangements.

The St. Monica's team is coached by Don Garland. The Buffalo team is coached by Richard Hehr and has won 11 games—six in the regular season and five in the playoffs.

A bus will leave St. Monica's on March 31 at 12:30 p.m. for Buffalo. After the game and supper the Rochester delegation will return.

St. Mary's School for the Deaf is a day and boarding school in the heart of Buffalo. The school is conducted by the Sisters of St. Joseph of the Buffalo Diocese and any deaf or hard of hearing child from New York State is admitted free.

Young People To Turn Out For Missions In 2 Churches

"The Whole Towns Talking About (not the Jones Boy) but the Young People's Mission" is the report of the committee in charge of arrangements at Holy Redeemer and St. Peter & Paul's Churches, Rochester.

From the interest shown already, it is expected that a large crowd of young people will begin the Missions in these churches, this Sunday night. Rev. Lawrence Shanley, S.J. will give the Mission at Holy Redeemer, and Rev. Paul Amy, S.J. at St. Peter & Paul's.

At Holy Redeemer, services will be held each evening at 7:00 p.m., Sunday through Friday, and the morning Mass and instruction will be at 7:00 a.m. At St. Peter & Paul's, the services will be at 7:45 each evening and the morning Mass at 6:45. Both churches will serve breakfast to those who are unable to return home and still be on time for school.

THE PARTICIPATING parishes at St. Peter & Paul's are: St. Lucy; St. Francis Assisi; St. Augustine; St. Monica; Holy Family and Immaculate Conception. Those participating at Holy Redeemer are: St. Michael's; St. Andrews; St. Francis Xavier; St. George; St. Stanislaus and Our Lady of Perpetual Help.

With the theme of "Mary, Queen of Youth, Guide Us" shrines will be erected in each church in honor of Our Lady, under whose patronage the Missions are being held. One parish and school will be "spotlighted" each evening with a teenager from that parish leading the Rosary, and a priest from that parish giving Benediction.

At Holy Redeemer church, that parish will be honored on Sunday night; St. Andrews on Monday night; St. George on Tuesday night; St. Michael's on Wednesday night; Our Lady of Perpetual Help on Thursday night; St. Stanislaus on Friday night. St. Peter & Paul's will be honored on Sunday night with a student from Madison saying the Rosary; St. Francis Assisi on Monday night with a student from Nazareth Academy; St. Augustine on Tuesday night with a student from West High School; Holy Family on Wednesday night with a student from Aquinas; St. Monica on Thursday night with a student from Mercy; Immaculate Conception on Friday with a student from St. Agnes.

Those making the Missions will be given the Papal Blessing at the completion, the same blessing that Our Holy Father would give if he were present to close the Missions. Students in both Public and Catholic High Schools are being urged by their pastors to attend.
