



protection to the uninformed against wrong interpretations and faise conclusions in Montreal-(NC) -The Quebec Board of Cinema Censors for a econd time has refused to allow the showing of the film "Martin Luther" in the province, The board first reviewed the film in December and declined to pprove it. At that time Alexis agnon, board chairman, issued i statement which said "the board feels it would be against the real interest of the population to have a film which would cause religious antagonistic sentiments." He added that the ban was in keeping with previous deisions of the province censorship board "regarding films offensive to various religious groups." SINCE MAKING its decision,

he board has been criticized by Protestant groups both in Canada and the United States. Mr. Gagnon said that the film was submitted to the board for a second time without alteration. After the second review, Mr. Sagnon said the board found no reason to change the December decision, which was unanimous, against the showing of the film. In the United States, the Na-


