Featured by presentation of two awards and dedication of a boxing ring, the Aquinas Mission bouts which presented 22 young fighters in all lively settings before a crowd of close to 4500 in the Sports Arena on April 1 are being acclaimed a complete success, this week.

For his outstanding efforts in his bout with Henry Angeline in the light middleweight class, Dick Tierney was presented the S. Ray Hickok Memorial Award by Ray Hickok, Dick who was declared a winner by a technical knockout defeated Henry Angeline in the second round after a minute and 58 seconds. Referee for this bout was Barney Ross, one time lightweight and welterweight champion.

**BOSS WAS** presented the first Aquinas Mission Bouts Award by Paul Miller, executive vice president of the Gannett Newspapers. The presentation was made in recognition of the work Ross has done to halt juvenile delinquency in this country.

Marking dedication of the Ernest (King) Mahoney ring, a rose was dropped by Abe Raff, Mission Bouts referee. He counted ten and the bell sounded ten times. The tribute was to the late, "King" Mahoney who had encouraged good sportsmanship among young boys.

The ring encounters opened with the atomweight bout, Randy Bianchi won a decision over John Welner. Randy handicapped by a bloody nose won the judges' nod over the able Welner.

The paperweight class was scheduled as Bell vs. Bell because the twin brothers had come out victors in the eliminations. Their father thought it best that they did not fight each other so George Schultz of the Holy Sepulchre Cemetery was matched with Tom Bell. Schultz who had previously lost to Bob Bell in

Featherweight champ, last year, Bob Fleming, lost his title to the older Corbett. Don, who like his brother showed natural ability, Fleming held on despite a beating and the fight ended in a decision for Corbett.

A decision was given Dave Hogan in the lightweight match. Dave despite his bloody face fought Mike Wade furiously and was acclaimed by the crowd.

Joe Holla won a decisive victory over Russ Guelli who had to overcome his opponent's long reach. Russ' brother Frank who was in his corner, recently represented Syracuse University in a national boxing show.

**FOLLOWING THE** Tierney-Angeline battle, the middleweight bout in which Jack McDonald stopped Sam Felix with a knock out after a minute and 52 seconds in the second round brought the crowd to their feet. Both are football stars.

Dave Doyle in the light heavy class took Gabe Milorn with a decision. Dave, like the two Corbetts and Mike Wade were all trained by Lou Langie.

Climaxing the card was the bout in which the 210 pounder,

Ken Shaw knocked out Chet Villa in the second round after 52 seconds of flying leather.

The program was handled by Bob Keefe of WHAM-TV. The Aquinas Band directed by Ray Hensauer played, Jerry Skarett sang. Officials were: Aile Graham, Elmer Thoney, Frank Duggan and Red Stalker. Sam Capa handled refereeing with Abe Raff.

Presented to the crowd was the Rev. Frederick J. Gehring, C.M., the famed "Guadalcanal Padre" who accompanied Barney Ross to the bouts, and the Rev. Arthur Loohey, C.S.B. director-of-mission activity at Aquinas.

Presented also were City Manager Robert Aex, Fire Chief Walter Adams and Chubby Brown, Cathedral high alumnus and former widely known boxer by Red Smith, announcer.

**CREDIT FOR** success of the affair was extended to Father Loohey, and the school's athletic director, the Rev. Cyril Carter, C.S.B. Cornell University was thanked for supplying the mat which the university paid to have shipped here. Batavia Downs was recognized for providing tickets for all the High Chair Kids and War Veterans from Bath U. S. Facility.

The bouts were broadcast for the first time this year, going out from Station WVET with Bob Trebor at the mike. The crowd purchased 1250 copies of a program produced by the students.
