Tito Police Arrest Students Who Protest Atheist Professor

YUGOSLAVIA — Staunch resistance to a communist indoctrination has led to the arrest of some 50 students at the University of Zagreb, Yugoslavia, according to information reaching here. The students were charged with "obstruction" and a "hostile attitude" to the communist professors. Mainly from the schools of law and engineering, the students were taken into custody by Tito's OZNA (secret police). It is expected that they will be formally expelled by the university. THE STUDENTS got into the trouble because of their objections to Dr. Marko Kostrenčić, law professor who has the reputation of being a "communist Voltare" and Rikard Podhorsky, professor of inorganic chemistry and an exponent of "scientific materialism."

Secret Bulgarian Radio Asks Mass Attendance

LONDON — (RNS) — A secret anti-communist radio station in Belgrade-controlled Bulgaria has been calling on the people here to demonstrate their unity against Communist oppression by mass attendance at Easter services. In the pre-Easter broadcast, Radio Goryanski (Man of the Forest) declared that "faith in God is the strongest bulwark of the Bulgarian people in times of suffering and trial." "Easter is approaching," the station said. "Let us unite in a demonstration of national unity against Communist oppression, a demonstration of religious and Christian resistance against Communist atheism." "Let us demonstrate by mass attendance at Easter services our abhorrence of Communist oppression and our firm belief in the triumph of justice and truth." The underground station de-

In past years, appeals were made to refrain from visiting the stigmatic on Good Friday.

365 Czech Nuns Going To Zurich

Geneva — (RNS) — Three hundred and sixty-five Catholic nuns of German origin are due to arrive shortly at Zurich from Czechoslovakia under the auspices of the International Red Cross. The nuns will re-establish themselves in the convent of the Sisters of the Holy Cross at Immenhof, in the Swiss Canton of Schwyz. The Red Cross said it had been busy for some time arranging the transfer of the nuns in accordance with the policy of regrouping displaced persons. It said that the Czechoslovak Communist regime had issued visas to the nuns and charged the Red Cross with organizing transportation and other arrangements.

Chinese Pupils Delay Arrest Of Their Priest

HONG KONG (NC) — Pupils at the Salesian Institute in Beijing delayed the arrest of their priest superior for two hours by forming a tight circle around him and refusing to let police seize him. The police finally prevailed on Father Paul Fong to quiet the crying, screaming boys. The priest addressed the pupils from the foot of a statue of Our Lady, Help of Christians. After his talk Father Fong went peacefully with the police as the boys sang a hymn to the blessed Virgin. Father Fong was one of 74 prominent laymen named by mass arrests last month. All were known for their staunch opposition to the regime's independent Catholic Church movement.

7 Deaneries Established; Bishop Appoints New Deans

His Excellency Bishop Kearney has approved a new regional arrangement of the 12-county Rochester Diocese into 7 deaneries and appointed priests to serve as deans in the respective districts. A deanery is an ecclesiastical subdivision of a diocese and usually includes several or more churches located outside the See City. A dean is a senior priest who, as the Bishop's vicar or representative, is entrusted with the care or vigilance of Church discipline in those parishes included in the area of the deanery.

THE NEW deanery arrangement which follows county lines and priests appointed to serve as deans are announced by the Chancery as follows: Chemung and Schuyler Deanery — The Rt. Rev. Msgr. William J. Brien, V.F., pastor of St. Patrick's Church in Elmira is the Dean.

Steuben Deanery — The Very Rev. Lawrence W. Gannon, V.F., pastor of St. Ann's Church in Hornell is the Dean.

Livingston Deanery — The Very Rev. John M. Ball, V.F., pastor of St. Rose Church in Lima is the Dean.

Wayne Deanery — The Very Rev. Joseph V. Curtin, V.F., pastor of St. John the Evangelist Church in Clyde is the Dean.

Cayuga Deanery — The Rt. Rev. John A. Conway, V.F., pastor of Holy Family Church in Auburn is the Dean.

Tompkins and Tioga Deanery — The Rt. Rev. Msgr. William Byrne, V.F., pastor of the Immaculate Conception Church in Ithaca is the Dean.

Ontario, Seneca and Yates Deanery — The Very Rev. Edward K. Ball, V.F., pastor of St. Francis-DeSales Church in Geneva is the Dean.

In Monroe County, which includes the See City of Rochester, the Bishop acts for himself and needs no dean.

The former regional or deanery division of the Rochester Diocese grouped churches according to their proximity to the major cities of the diocese and included the deaneries of Rochester, Auburn, Elmira, Geneva and Corning.

The priest who serves as a dean is also known as a "vicar forane," which explains the use of the initials "V.F." after his name. "Vicarius forane" (rural dean or vicar) designates a priest who acts as the Bishop's vicar or representative to a group of churches located outside of the Episcopal See area.



Pro-Red GI's Illustrate Value Of Church 'Index'

New York — (NC) — American GI's who joined the Korean Red as "progressives" were cited in TV arguments explaining why the Church guards Catholics from false ideas.

American prisoners who read communist literature and didn't have the equipment to handle it lost their freedom by joining the Reds; the Church tries to protect the freedom of its members by helping them from books on subjects about which the average man does not have sufficient knowledge, a priest explained.

"Our soldiers were being indoctrinated and some were not equipped. So they lost faith in America and the ideals they were fighting for," Father John Reynolds said during a Catholic Hour "pulpit debate" in which a priest-opponent had called the Church "The Enemy of Freedom."

The Paulist Father explained that just as some GI's did not have sufficient background on the fundamentals of democracy, most laymen are not equipped with fields of theology and scripture to recognize fallacy and error.

He said that Catholics, like children who trust a wiser parent, depend on the greater wisdom, knowledge and experience of the Church "without giving up their liberties."

"The number of books forbidden is relatively small against the many that can be read," Father Reynolds said.

Pope To Record Easter Message

Vatican City — (RNS) — Pope Pius XII will give his Easter Message to the assembled throng in St. Peter's Square by way of a tape recording, Vatican sources said.

It was said the Pope is not yet strong enough to deliver the message personally and that it is being prepared in sections on tape.

This will be the first time in the 45-year reign of the Pontiff that he has not given his message directly from the balcony of the Papal apartments. Pope Pius has been suffering from a gastric ailment since Jan. 25.

TV To Show Holy Father's Easter Blessing

Vatican City — (NC) — Holy Week began in Rome with the televising for the first time of the solemn papal Easter blessing "Urbi et orbi" to the city and the world.

Easter Sunday is expected to see Pope Pius pronouncing the customary Easter blessing, with television cameras recording the details and transmitting them. The Vatican press office announced that the Holy Father, who appears to be making a slow recovery from his long illness, would give the blessing at noon. But it did not say anything about the place or the form of the blessing.

It was considered possible that the Pontiff would impart the blessing at the window of his study, but rumors of the way he would appear in the Easter liturgy have been dispelled. It was also thought possible that Pope Pius would deliver a brief message on the occasion of his strength permitting.

Prayers for Easter Monday offer a special Oratio Commemoratio at 12:30, followed by the solemn Mass. The Holy Father will preside at the Mass, which will be broadcast on television.
