## War Veterans Resolve On Divorce Bills

At a recent meeting of Catholic War Veterans, Monroe County Chapter, three resolutions were passed by the membership, according to James C. Batz, adjutant.

It was resolved that the Chapter go on record as opposing the Gordon-Peterson bill which is designed to set up a commission to study the divorce problems in the State and which the CWV sees as a first step in the relaxation of these laws.

**ENDORSEMENT** WAS given to the Mahoney-Wilson bill, which the CWV feels, if passed, would do much to deter divorces and annulments, and thus preserve the home and rebound to the common good.

Regarding the motion picture "French Line," the following affirmative action was resolved by the Veterans:

"1. If the film is advertised to be shown by any theatre in the area, each individual member is to protest to that theatre at once, preferably by phone but at least by letter.

"2. IF ANY THEATRE actually shows the picture each individual member is to write the manager of that theatre a letter telling him that the individual member and all other members of our organization and their families will not attend his theatre or any other affiliated theatre for a period of six months.

"3. Each individual member is to strongly urge other organizations of which he is a member, both Catholic or non-Catholic, to also carry out the above program."

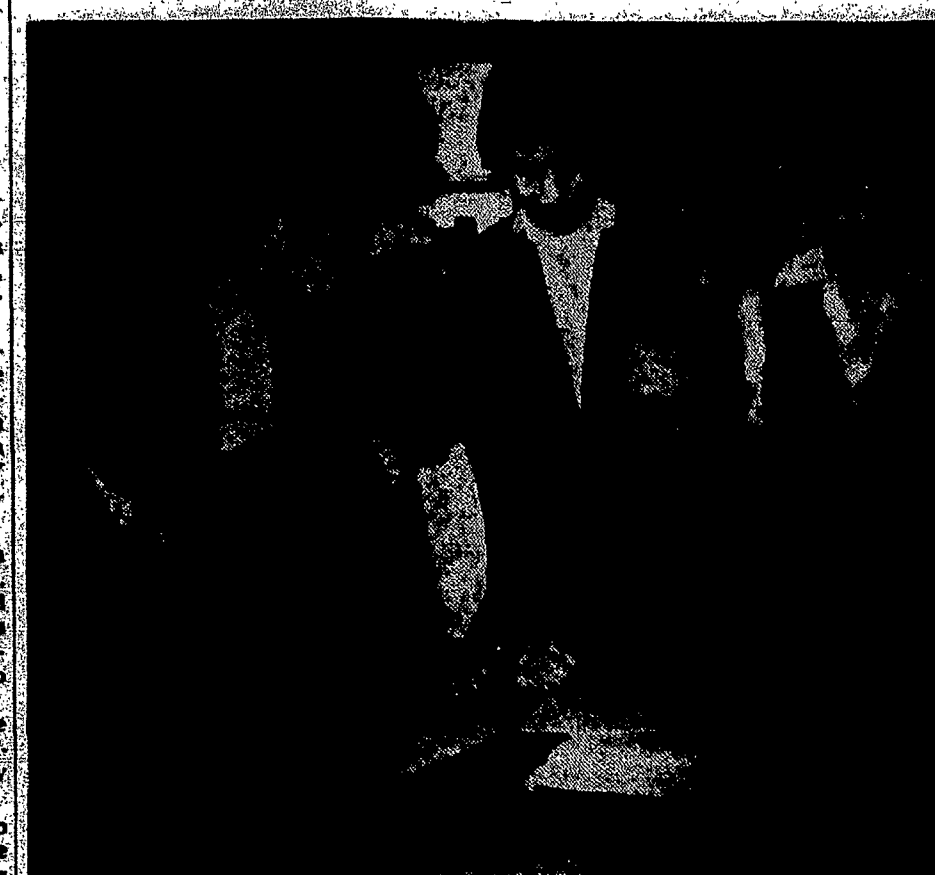

## Nurses To Visit Canadian Shrines

New York - Notable events of the year for Catholic Nurses will be the 1954 Pilgrimage of Catholic nurses to Canadian Shrines and the visit to the Fifth International Congress of Catholic Nurses at Quebec September 7 to 12. The Pilgrimage will be under the Spiritual Direction of Father Garesche, S.J., whom the Holy Father has appointed honorary Spiritual Director of the International Committee of Catholic Nurses Association and other priests who will accompany the pilgrimage.

Three tours will leave New York in late August or early September, respectively, and visit the beautiful Canadian country and the shrines of the Blessed Virgin and the Saints.

The first tour to Gaspé Peninsula and the Quebec Shrines will depart from New York by bus on August 30, and visit Maine, Perce and the Gaspé Peninsula and arrive at Quebec to assist at the Congress; thence to Montreal and back to New York.

The second tour to Saguenay and the Quebec Shrines leaves on Sept. 7 by train from New York and goes to Montreal to take the boat for the St. Lawrence River and the Saguenay; thence down the Saguenay to the Congress at Quebec and from there to Montreal, arriving in New York by boat on Sept. 13.

The third tour to Ontario and the Quebec Shrines will go by coach through New York to the Poonos; to Toronto and the Thousand Islands and then to Montreal and Quebec, returning by way of the White Mountains to arrive in New York on Sept. 14.
