Marine Veteran Paid Final Tribute

Born in Corning July 30, 1925, Mr. Degliequ was the son of Romano and Rose DePalo Degliequ Sr. A graduate of St. Vincent de Paul's Parochial School he served in the second marine division in the Pacific area during World War II.

Although a member of St. Vincent de Paul's Parish, he had attended St. Mary's Church for the past few months. He was employed by Frank D'Andrea. GOD LOVE YOU!

ALMOST everybody is praying for a favor, but the trouble is that almost all we ever do is just pray. When the apostles were unable to drive the devil out of a man, Our Lord said that evil was only driven out by prayer and fasting. By fasting is meant self-denial or sacrifice.

We are in constant amazement and thankfulness at the number of favors that are granted to those who not only pray but also promise to make a sacrifice for the Society for the Propagation of the Faith.

Here is a letter that recently came to us: "I am much interested in the missions. Having reached my thirties without having attained the vocation I desired—marriage—I promised God if He would see fit to grant me marriage that at the time I got married I would give to the Holy Father's Missions my savings over and above \$2,500, after payment of certain expenses etc. I am now engaged to a Catholic man and we are planning a July or August wedding."

Why not make a sacrifice like this to the Holy Father's Missions for a favor? It is because the spread of the Faith is so dear to Our Lord, that He grants such favors.

One of the best ways to combine prayer and sacrifice is to make a sacrifice of \$1 or more and request a World Mission Society that reminds you by order to pray for someone else. Our Lord will not only be pleased that you gave up something for His Missions but that you pray for them as well.

I was glad to take my pills because I was taking them for the missions. I hope my dollar will help some little girl my age." to A. B. "During Lent I denied myself a little pleasure trip and decided to send a gift of \$5 to the Missions." to S. S. for \$2. "I hope to be a graduate of grammar school and realize full well that your Rosary will be more helpful than a class ring—this my choice." to M. A. B. for \$1.58. "Enclosed is some money I saved from my weekly allowance by not buying candy." to W. S. "Enclosed is a check for \$10.54, my commission on selling cards. I promised Christ if I could sell over \$300 wholesale in order to be entitled for the bonus. I would give it all to help spread our faith." to A. M. C. "I am enclosing \$11.65, a day's pay which I promised for the Propagation of the Faith each month for a year." to E. B. "I don't eat candy during Lent. I figure I eat 10c worth a day so 10 times 40-days equal \$4." to M. H. H. for \$15. "I figure with Federal and State getting their share about this time, the missions should have some too." to M. M. S. for \$5. "I lost it. I found it. It's yours." to M. P. "Enclosed find \$10 as an expression of my gratitude to God for many blessings."
