In addressing the gathering of some 200 spectators, the Bishop said: “Every one of the Carmelite monasteries is a new Bethlehem. From here the Son of God will come to take up dwelling in this community. From here the Lord will operate. Anything we do to multiply the Bethlehem will serve the community.”

MANY OF THE diocesan clergy were present, but only one representative of the seven Sisters of Carmel observed the rites, which is in keeping with the rules of the Order.

The present monastery is located at 1530 East Ave. The new building will house a public chapel and a bell tower in addition to the nun's accommodations. The site is just opposite Locust Hill Country Club.


April 22 is the day of Catholic High's Junior-Senior Prom! At 9 p.m. Dick Hamlin's orchestra will start four hours of music.
