

## Rochesterians To Be Ordained In Buffalo, San Diego; First Mass Slated Here

Charles Joseph Dolan, son of Mrs. Edward P. Kelly, and the late Charles J. Dolan will be ordained to the Sacred Priesthood for the Diocese of San Diego, California, by the Most Reverend Charles F. Euddy, Bishop of San Diego, on May 5th. The ordination will take place at St. Joseph's Cathedral in San Diego.

He was born on April 14, 1926 in Rochester, N. Y., and attended Our Lady of Good Counsel and Immaculate Conception Grammar Schools in his native city. He was graduated from St. Andrew's Seminary, Rochester, in 1947 and studied philosophy and theology at New Melleray Abbey in Dubuque, Iowa; St. Bernard's Seminary, Rochester, and Immaculate Heart Seminary in El Cajon, California.

Father Dolan's First Solemn Mass will be celebrated at Immaculate Conception Church in Rochester, N. Y., on May 9th, followed by a public reception in the School Auditorium in the afternoon from 3 p.m. until 6 p.m.

A brother of the newly ordained priest, the Rev. Bernard F. Dolan, assistant pastor at Holy Rosary Church, Rochester, will be chaplain at the ordination and preacher at the First Mass. Another brother, Mr. David Kelly, a novice in the Basilian congregation, will be Master of Ceremonies at the Mass.


