THE Gospel tells us of a long weary day when Our Lord preached many parables, engaged in a long prolonged debate with His enemies, discoursed on the blasphemy against the Holy Spirit, and told His Mother that oneness to the Father's Will constitutes the new relationship with Him. Then at the end of the day came the hard pillow of the boat as the resting place for His wearied head. He slept through the storm that followed the sunset.


