THE Gospel tells us of a long weary day when Our Lord preached many parables, engaged in a long prolonged debate with His enemies, discoursed on the blasphemy against the Holy Spirit, and told His Mother that oneness with the Father's Will constitutes the new relationship with Him. Then at the end of the day came the hard pillow of the boat as the resting place for His wearied head. He slept through the storm that followed the sunset.

The Apostles aroused Him, so fearful were they of the storm. The lips that were closed in breathing sleep, now opened to utter the omnipotent word to the waves: "Peace be still". Notice that Our Lord puts aside the claims of physical wants to minister the needs of others.

## After School Pick-up Rides

Parents were warned this week to check on the practice of their teenage daughters being picked up after school by boy friends driving old model cars.

The warning was issued by Sister M. Francesca, principal of Our Lady of Mercy High School, in the monthly P.T.A. Bulletin, "Principal's Perspective."

"Many of these jalopies, hot rods, sometimes 'crates,' look unsafe for your daughter," the Principal said. "Their safety is not increased when three or four boys are in the car picking up one girl."

"There would be less concern for the school and less regret for parents after an accident or scandal" if parents would make rules about their daughter's transportation to and from school, Sister Francesca continued.

The Principal warned: "Show off drivers, making wildly with your daughter endanger her good name if not her safety."

## 'Catholic-To-Protestant' Convert Study 'Faulty'

lack of any explanation of the method used raises strong doubt as to the legitimacy of the "cross-section" label.

7) Small Response — "For 25,000 letters sent out only 2,219 replies were received over a period of months. Only 8.9 percent responded. . . . The poor response . . . seriously challenges the reliability of any general conclusions."

8) Cities Only — "any conclusions reached would at most apply only to cities, not to rural America or growing suburbs."

9) A KEY ERROR — "We are told that ministers replying (to the poll) represent 'slightly more than one percent' of Protestant clergymen serving churches. It does not follow at all that this

group, actually 1.2 per cent, serves only 1.2 percent of the membership or receives only 1.2 percent of members on confession of faith. Yet the Herald makes this preposterous assumption."

10) Mathematical Projection — "The Herald's own statement is: 'From the ministers replying and converts reported, a mathematical projection to the total number of church-serving pastors in the United States, produces the startling nationwide figure of 414,368 Roman Catholic to Protestant converts.'" Dr. Trimble said that "startling" was a mild word. "The actual process," he said, "of multiplying by 83 and a fraction is for all the reasons above, and others that might be given, little short of fantastic."

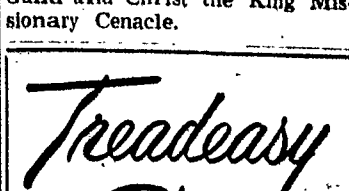
