THE WORK TO be exhibited was done under the direction of the Nazareth College art department faculty, which consists of Hermann Wild, assistant in commercial art; James D. Havens, A.N.A., assistant in fine arts; Nancy Tice, assistant in interior decoration; Sylvia Davis, assistant in fine arts; Alice White, assistant in crafts; John Solowski, instructor of art education; and Sister Magdalen.

Among the works to be shown, Sister Magdalen said, are oils, water colors, pastels, tempera, charcoal, textile designs, fashion illustrations, ceramics, weaving and leather, metal and paper crafts.
