J. T. Reilly Of Geneva, Dies

Geneva—Funeral services for Jeremiah J. Reilly, 94, 25 Hoffmann Ave., were held Saturday in DeVaney and Co. Funeral Home, 137 N. Main St., at 8:45 a.m. in St. Stephen's Church.

Mr. Reilly died April 21, 1954 in his home.

The Rev. William E. Davis, Auburn, Mr. Reilly's nephew, celebrated the Solemn High Requiem Mass. The Rev. Joseph Hogan was deacon. The Rev. William Hickey was sub-deacon.

Burial was in St. Patrick's Cemetery. The Rev. William Davis officiated, assisted by the Rev. Joseph Hogan.

Bearers were Joseph, Gerald, and James Hill, Rochester; George W. Jenkins, Jr., Pvt. William Robert Reilly, U. S. Army, and Pfc. Patrick Corcoran, U. S. Marine Corps.

Born March 11, 1870, in this city, Mr. Reilly was one of 11 children of Jeremiah J. and Ellen Pyne Reilly. He was educated in Geneva public and parochial schools and lived his entire life here.

His wife was the late Catherine Stedman. Two of his sisters were members of the Order of the Sisters of St. Joseph in Rochester. They were Sister Ernestine and Sister Alice. Both died within the last few years.

FOR MANY YEARS, Mr. Reilly was employed with the Shuron Optical Company. In 1949 he retired after working more than 20 years at the Patent Cereals Company. At one time, he served as caretaker of Washington St. Cemetery.

Mr. Reilly was a member of St. Stephen's Church and of the Holy Name Society of that church. He also belonged to the Knights of Columbus.

His survivors are three sons, Edward Leo, Chicago; John P., and William Hill, both of this city; four daughters, Mrs. Margaret Hill and Mrs. Catherine Griffith, both of Rochester; and Mrs. Helen Jenkins and Mrs. Anne Lowery, both of this city; several grandchildren and several great-grandchildren.


Mother's Plan Communion Breakfast At Mt. Read
