AT THE CHAPTER, the Very Rev. William F. Gaudreau, C.S.S.R., of New York was elected Superior General, first American to attain that high position in the Redemptorist Congregation. A noted expert of canon law and educator, he had been a member of the faculty of the seminary at Exopus for 20 years as professor of canon law and moral theology. He was ordained in 1924 at St. Albans Seminary, Exopus. His successor here was ordained on June 19, 1952, and has been in missionary work out of St. Albans Seminary, New York City. He served as an Army Chaplain in World War 2 and as professor of St. Mary's College, North East, Pa. He was born in Boston.


