Campus Marian Rites Set By Knights Of St. John

What promises to be one of the most outstanding religious demonstrations ever sponsored by the Knights of St. John will take place Sunday afternoon, May 25, on the grounds of Nazareth College, East Avenue, Pittsford.

Extensive plans are being made which invites the co-operation of every member of the Rochester Regiment and every member of the District Auxiliary, both uniformed and non-uniformed.

All members of the uniformed rank, both Knights and ladies, have been ordered to form companies on the grounds of the Mother House of the Sisters of St. Joseph, East Avenue at 3:30 P.M.

The line of march will move promptly at 4 o'clock and will proceed to the area on the campus of Nazareth College where a temporary outdoor altar will be erected. Before this altar will be formed the living Rosary, in the shape of a heart, commemorating the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

THE ENTIRE Rosary will be formed by alternating uniformed Knights and Ladies. At 4:15 p.m. the recitation of the Rosary will be started by Rt. Rev. Msgr. Joseph H. Geffel, Chaplain of Rochester Regiment. At approximately 5 P.M. the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass will be celebrated at the outdoor altar by Monsignor Geffel.

During the Mass, appropriate hymns honoring the Blessed Lady will be sung by the combined choir and glee club of Nazareth College and St. John Fisher College. Following the Mass a short discourse will be given by the Rev. Louis J. Hohman. The observance will be terminated with the singing of the Te Deum. Music for marching will be furnished by the Aquinas Institute Band under the direction of Raymond J. Hasenauer.

A special invitation has been extended to the students of all primary and secondary schools in the city, to the students of St. Andrews Seminary and to representatives of all Catholic Lay Organizations in the city. Written invitations have been sent to every parish in the city.
