### Bishop Kearney To Preside At Knights Mass

More than 5000 persons are expected to attend the 59th annual Convention of New York State Council, Knights of Columbus in Rochester on Friday and Saturday, May 28 and 29. His Excellency Bishop Kearney will preside at a Solemn Pontifical Mass opening the convention at St. Joseph's Church on Friday, May 28, at 9:30 a.m. Coadjutor Bishop William A. Scully will celebrate the Mass. Sermon will be preached by the Very Rev. John J. Forman, rector of the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, Albany. A CIVIO welcome will take place at the opening session in Seneca Hotel at which State Deputy Denis A. Mansfield will preside at 11:30 a.m. Delegates from the 269 subordinate councils in the Empire State jurisdiction will hear reports of state chairmen and officers and make plans for the coming fraternal year. State officers will be elected by the 545 knights entitled to vote at the annual gathering. Outstanding event will be the Annual State Banquet in the Seneca Ballroom with Bishop Kearney as honored guest. Principal speaker will be State Deputy Mansfield. John J. Kirney of Rochester Council, general convention chairman, announced several programs arranged for wives of delegates to enjoy during convention sessions.

### First McQuaid High Exam Wins Grants For 3 Boys

First competitive scholarship examination for the new McQuaid Jesuit High School was held on Saturday, May 8 at 9:30 a.m. in the Auditorium of Columbus Civic Centre. One hundred and eighty-seven boys representing 35 parochial schools and one public school took part in the competition. Rev. Lorenzo K. Reed, S.J., Director of Secondary Education in the New York Province of the Society of Jesus conducted the examination assisted by five priests from Canisius High School in Buffalo. FIRST PLACE on a 4-year tuition-free scholarship valued at \$960 was awarded to Lawrence Joseph Belter, 80 Lettington Drive. Lawrence is an eighth grade pupil at St. Helen's School. Second in the examination and winner of a half-scholarship worth \$480.00 was Thomas Joseph Gilmartin of 204 Dorstone Road, also an eighth grade student at St. Helen School. In third place and winner of another half-tuition scholarship was Philip Maury Maley, 262 Warwick Ave. Philip is in the eighth grade of St. Augustine School. These boys will be in the first class entering McQuaid Jesuit High School this coming September. The new high school is now in the process of construction on a 26 acre site at the corner of Clinton Ave. South and Elmwood Avenue in Brighton. Until the new school is ready for occupancy, classes will be held in the former St. Andrew Seminary on the corner of Plymouth Ave. North and Brown St.
