Maryknoll Bishop Listed In Aquinas Mission Talk

Bishop Raymond A. Lane, Superior General of the Maryknoll Fathers, will speak to Aquinas Institute student body at the Final Mission Assembly on Friday, June 4. The Rev. Arthur Looby, C.S.B., moderator of mission activities at Aquinas, has made plans to bring the Bishop here to address the students on mission activities. Last year's speaker was Bishop Fulton J. Sheen.

The assembly will mark the closing of another year of the Aquinas Mission Crusade of which, in the last 17 years has raised over \$200,000 for the foreign and home missions, with last year's total of \$23,049.00.

Bishop Lane was born Jan. 2, 1894, in Lawrence, Mass. He studied for the priesthood at St. John's Preparatory School, before entering Maryknoll College in 1913. Upon completion he was ordained, Feb. 8, 1920.


After serving as the Seminary Procurator for three years he was assigned to Hongkong and in 1925 appointed to a new territory in Fuhun, Manchuria. In 1928, he returned to this country to take up administrative duties and serve as rector at the Major Seminary at Maryknoll.

Back to the Orient in 1932 on an appointment from the Holy See as Perfect Apostle of Fuhun and later, in 1940, he was named Vicar Apostolic there. He was consecrated Bishop on June 11, 1940 in Lawrence, Mass.

He was taken prisoner by Japan, following the attack on Pearl Harbor and liberated with U. S. Army officers, on V-J Day, Aug. 14, 1945.

Successing Bishop James E. Walsh, he was elected Superior General of the Maryknoll Fathers on August 7, 1946. He was the third Superior General of the order which was founded in 1911. Bishop Lane was selected for the 1953 award of the Catholic Association for International Peace, presented to those Americans whose outstanding achievements have helped further Christian principles of justice and of charity in international life. He also received the 1953 Christopher Columbus Award, for Maryknoll's contribution to the enrichment of the spiritual, cultural and educational life of Latin America.

Newest In X-Ray Machines Installed At St. Mary's

As a fitting celebration of National Hospital Week, Sister Martina, administrator of St. Mary's Hospital, announced the installation of a radically new type of diagnostic unit in the X-Ray Department of that hospital. This is the first machine of its type to be available to Rochester residents, and one of the earliest to be installed in the United States.

The new unit is considered a complete break with the conventional, according to medical observers, who predict it will eventually be accepted as standard by physicians, since it obsoletes previous designs.

THE OFFICIAL name of this new equipment is the "Imperial Model" General Electric X-Ray Machine. It possesses a wider range of use than previous machines and also has greater maneuverability and smoother operation. Because of this, it is no longer necessary to move a patient in order to get various views.

The X-Ray table can be tilted to any position within a 180 degree angle in either direction for the table is attached to a huge, wheel-like metal construction, around which the table travels.

ANOTHER ADVANCED development in this "Imperial" apparatus is the automatic selection of film exposure by photo-electric cells. This eliminates the need for the X-Ray technician to be responsible for the film time exposure.

Important, too, is the provision of reduction in "gadgets" which has plagued modern X-ray equipment as new features after feature was added on to old-style equipment. The bulky tube stand and the rail along which technicians formerly had to push the tube stand is now gone. The tube is merely suspended from an overhead rail.

The acquisition of the new Imperial will prove to be a boon to patients, doctors, and X-Ray personnel.
