### Inaugurate Campaign Method Of Election At Mercy High

Our Lady of Mercy High School will hold elections Tuesday, May 25 and the outcome will decide the new Student Government Association president for next year. "For the first time, Mercy is inaugurating the campaign method for the election of the president of the S. G. A.," informs Joan Skeet, this year's president.

Juniors Joan Benham, Carol Young were elected from a group of ten nominees from the junior class to campaign for this office. Their managers are juniors Beverly Benham, Marie Lynch and Carol Bieck.

Joan Benham's party, the "Mohicans," have announced that their main platform is to solve the busline traffic problems by having a row of signs, similar to stop signs, along the busline with room only for double file. This will make departure from school easier and quicker.

Carol Skeet's "Sticcarts" plan to reorganize the Student Government Association into three groups: 1) Legislative, made up of council members; 2) Judicial, made up of court representatives elected in a separate election by the homerooms; 3) Executive, made up of the president and other S.G.A. officers.

Carol Young's "Young Realists," will have as their main platform a change in court procedure, highlighting 1) more respect for the accused and her defense; 2) president will act as judge with councilmen as the questioners; 3) certain common offenses will have set penalties.

SISTER Mary Beatrice, moderator of the S.G.A. comments: "Since this S.G.A. innovation is intended to simulate the democratic process as it is practiced in the United States, I think it will be a valuable experience for the candidates and the electors.

### 3 Colleges Announce Exercises

Windsor, Ont. — Assumption College will confer honorary degrees for the first time at a convocation to be held June 3. Eight men and a woman, prominent in political, literary, and educational life of Western Ontario will be honored.

Heading the list is the Hon. Leslie M. Frost, Premier of Ontario. Hon. Paul Martin, Federal Minister of Health and Welfare, and Hon. Charles P. McTague, one-time member of the Supreme Court of Ontario are to be similarly honored.

The oldest member of the Basilian Order, the Rev. W. J. Roach will be recognized for his long service in the field of education. He has been a teacher for 58 years.

### Hospitals Duty In Training Staff Stressed By Dr. Butler

The hospital's responsibility in the training of physicians through a sound house staff (internes and resident physicians) training program was stressed by Dr. John J. Butler, director of medical education, St. Mary's Hospital, Rochester, in a panel discussion on Intern Education before the 38th annual convention of the Catholic Hospital Association of United States and Canada meeting in Atlantic City.

Dr. Butler said that everyone in the hospital from the administrator to the "merit who run the noisy floor polishes during ward rounds" have to think in terms of education.

He urged appointment and advancement of the medical staff on the basis of ability and willingness to teach and warned that seniority alone as a criterion for advancement "can be deadly". He said that it is being recog-
