What Can You Do For Peace?



Face to face with the hydrogen bomb, what can you and I personally do to help to establish world peace...

Here they are: 1. Victory over hatred. Victory, therefore, over the cruelties and falsehoods to which hatred gives rise...

2. VICTORY OVER distrust between peoples. Without that victory, how can nations cooperate?

3. Victory over the hateful principle that force can create law, that 'might makes right'.

4. Victory over the mad ambition of the world's gods—the too great differences in the realm of things economic.

5. Victory over the spirit of egoism. On these five principles, each of us can base a salutary examination of conscience.

Do I have anybody—any individual, any class, any race, any nation? If so, how can I be fair?—how a maker of peace?

Let's get right about our cases. Do I, for example, unconsciously believe what England's is mentioned, or Poland's, or some other nation's? Do I assume, for example, that the Englishman is to be trusted, or the Jew?

Do I believe in the right of the stronger? Or conversely, in the poor, the illiterate? Do I believe in them?

SUCH QUESTIONS arise from the first and second points. Take the third point, Do I really think that might really is right, if exercised by my own country?—that any military step taken by my nation is necessarily all right?

The fourth point... Do I oppose the idea of immigration? Do I have a dog-in-manger attitude toward those who would like to come to my country for a new start in life?

The fifth point is more subtle, but it is at the root of all strife and war. Am I humble? If not, I'm a dead drag on mankind's striving for peace.

POPE PIUS ALSO laid down certain fundamental international principles which must be followed if we are to achieve peace.

One principle is this—patriotism must be right patriotism, not wrong patriotism.

A great deal of patriotism is nothing better than bad national pride and selfishness. It is not a virtue; it is a vice; a corroding sin. It turns a man into a fanatical nationalist, a hater of other nations, a kind of national miser, hugging his own country to his breast, and peering hatefully at all other countries.

Here are the Pope's other international principles for peace: 1. All nations have a right to freedom and security.

2. All nations should agree to disarm.

3. International courts should have power to enforce international law. (You don't like that? Well, the burglars would love it if we deprived our local courts of power to enforce law).

4. The real needs of various peoples must be recognized, and satisfied.

5. Both governments and peoples must acquire a deep sense of responsibility before God.

What can you do to bring peace to the world? You can accept the Pope's principles, and promote them.
