Registration For Reading Program Set At Holy Family

Auburn — Registration for classes in Remedial Reading to be conducted at Holy Family School this summer is scheduled for Thursday, June 3 and Friday, June 4 from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. at the school.

Sister Mary Helene of Our Lady of Mercy Reading Laboratory in Rochester will act as Registrar. Interviewing parents who wish to register their children.

THE better and the worse contend in all Christian souls, or as Our Lord put it with merciful leniency: "The Spirit is winning; the flesh is weak." Meditate on the earthly life of Our Lord.
