carnation on the wreath in memory of John Gudinas, after whom the Post was named. He then read the roll of the deceased members. After reading all the names, the Gold Star Mothers pinned a white carnation on the wreath. Among the 21 deceased, 2 were casualties of World War I.

The Rev. Dominic Mokevicius stressed the importance of this type of ceremony and above all reminding all that the deceased should not be forgotten in prayer.

The Gudinas Post Firing Squad, under the direction of Fred Farmer, Sgt. at Arms, fired a salute in memory of its departed "comrades" and Taps were sounded.

Following these rites the members of both the Post and Auxiliary went to the church hall for breakfast.
