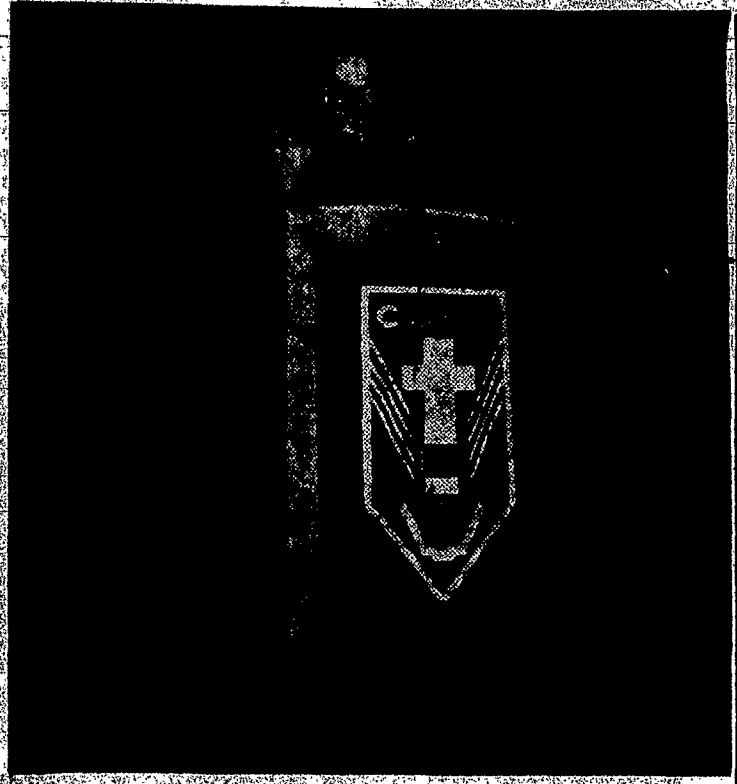


# \$26,759 Raised For Missions Tops All Aquinas Records



CONGRATULATIONS to Aquinas Institute's Catholic Student Mission Crusade Unit on its \$26,759 record sum raised for the missions during the year is extended by Bishop Raymond A. Lane, M.M., Superior General of the Maryknoll Fathers was guest of honor.

An all-time record of \$26,759 was reported by Aquinas Institute Mission Crusade unit at an assembly in the Dewey Ave. School, June 4, at which Bishop Raymond A. Lane, M.M., Superior General of the Maryknoll Fathers was guest of honor.

This year's total raised by the students during the scholastic year tops all other years and brings the total raised by Aquinas students during the past 16 years to \$187,396.

The Rev. Anthony Lococo's homeroom, 323, led the school and established a new homeroom record with \$2,300. It was also Father Lococo's first homeroom in 16 years to bring him in first.

Rev. John Wilson's 316 gave keen competition to the top homeroom but had to settle with second place and \$1,632. Completing the "Big Three" was the third senior homeroom, Rev. Joseph O'Reilly's 320 with \$1,519.

Rev. Michael Blonidi's junior homeroom, 219 placed fourth in the top five and Rev. Frank Sheahan's senior 321 was fifth.

EVERY YEAR, the "Paladin Award" is made for outstanding services to the Missions. This year's recipient was James O'Connor, editor of the school's Mission publication the "Aquinas". Every year also an award, the "Order of St. Louis the Crusader" is presented to a deserving student but this year, two of these awards were presented. Greg Britz, president of the Mission Crusade at Aquinas and Mission leader of the top homeroom and Charles McKenna, Mission Bout makidmaker and Mission leader of the second top homeroom were the recipients.

The Homeroom collections make up the bulk of the tremendous sum raised this year. They amounted to \$12,659. The successful Mission Bouts undertaken netted \$7,500 on ticket sales and \$5,100 on the program. The Christmas Car sales also broke a record this year with \$3,500. All the proceeds go to support the Home and Foreign Missions. In the past five years, five Mission Churches have been completely financed by Aquinas, for the Mexicans in Texas, totaling \$75,000.00. The rest went to foreign missions.

SPECIAL AID is given to former Aquinas students in the Mission. Rev. Bernard E. Brown, an Oblate Missionary in the Arctic, Fr. Mark Consoli, a Precious Blood Missionary in Hawaii and Rev. Joseph Tierney, a Holy Cross Missionary in Pakistan have all received help from the Aquinas Missions.

Besides Bishop Lane several other guests were on hand to greet the student body. The Very Rev. John F. Murphy, C.S.B., President of St. John Fisher College commended the boys on their fine work. Also from St. John Fisher was the Rev. John Oronato C.S.B., director of the Mission Society at the college.

The Director of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, the Very Rev. Magr. John S. Randall invited the three award winners with their medals. Accompanying Bishop Lane was the Maryknoll Father, the Rev. Robert Lacy of Buffalo.

Closing the Mission Assembly, the Rev. Arthur Lookey, C.S.B., Director of the Mission Crusade said "We have just closed another glorious year in Mission activities at Aquinas. In the months to come missionaries in every part of the world will say special prayers of thanksgiving for the generosity of you boys of Aquinas whose sacrifice will enable them to carry on their work of giving spiritual and material comfort to those less fortunate than us."

"Indeed we can be proud of our school and God bless each and everyone of you who cooperated so wonderfully to make this year such a successful one in the missions as well as other student activities."

He said that the sacrament of confession is unchanged, and the doctrines preached from the pulpit are the same.

# Ad Altare Dei Award Set For 107 Scouts Tonight

One hundred and seven Boy Scouts from two areas in the Diocese of Rochester will receive the Ad Altare Dei cross from His Excellency Bishop Kearney in the sixth annual ceremony to be held this year at St. Andrew's Church, Foxland Ave. Friday, June 11 at 7:45 p.m.

Sponsored by the Catholic Lay Committee on Scouting which was started by Bishop Kearney, the ceremony is open to all interested in scouting particularly those in charge of Catholic sponsored troops according to Edward M. Luschel, lay committee chairman.

THE PRESENTATION of 107 awards for spiritual achievement in connection with scouting is the largest in the history of the Catholic scout movement in this diocese. Eighty-five boys received the award last year.

This year, 80 boys from various sections in the Rochester Diocese who are affiliated with OLPH Area Council will receive the cross and 27 from Westabon Area Council including Herron, Wayland, Corning and Danville will be rewarded.

Prior to the ceremony a procession will form in the Church Hall to be led by St. Margaret Mary's School band, Frank H. Melville, director, William Donatoni, director, William Donatoni, director of St. Andrew's is parade marshal.

# Mt. Carmel School Rededication Set By Bishop Kearney

His Excellency Bishop Kearney will officiate at the rededication and official reopening of Mt. Carmel School on Sunday, June 13, at 7:30 p.m. Thereafter, the Bishop will address the people of the parish in the school hall.

Two years ago the remodeling of the school was begun and the project was completed last year. More classrooms were added and the structure was modernized.

ON NOVEMBER 2, 1953 the building was the scene of a disaster. Fire consumed the upper part of the building and the tremendous amount of water required to extinguish the flames thoroughly soaked the remainder of the structure.

It was necessary to tear out the whole inside of the building. In five months, however, this task had been completed and the children were able to return to their school.

VARIOUS CHANGES were also necessary on the outside of the building. A new roof and rebuilding of part of one wall were undertaken, and a new entrance was erected. The existing walls were raised and capped.

Public inspection of the structure will follow the dedication ceremonies.
