**Attends Melkite Seminary Rite**

Dedication of St. Basil's Seminary of the Basilian Salvatorian Order at Methuen near Lawrence, Mass., on May 30 was witnessed by Mrs. Frank S. Frijth, 2086 Norton St., Rochester.

Participating in dedication of the Grey Court residence of the late millionaire Daniel G. Tenney was Archbishop Richard J. Cushing of Boston and the Rt. Rev. Archimandrite Nicholas Burkhoof, of Lebanon, superior general of the Basilian Salvatorian Order who came to America by special permission of the Holy See in Rome.

THE CEREMONY which was said to be the first of its kind held in the history of the Church in the Western hemisphere attracted 10,000 persons of the Latin and Melkite rites.

Archbishop Cushing announced a gift of \$10,000 for the Seminary to prepare young men for priesthood in the Melkite rite.

"I rejoice with you, my dear people of the Melkite Rite in this happy, historical and unique occasion in the history of all Catholics, the world over," Archbishop Cushing said.

"You are proud of your Rite. It is one of the oldest in the Church. It is one of the most beautiful. You have wonderful traditions and you have been loyal to the Vicar of Christ," the prelate said.
