Parental Blessing

In a charming little pamphlet entitled "Bless Your Children" (published by the Grail Publications, 50 St. Mein, Inc., 174 Madison Ave., New York 17, N.Y.), the author writes:
"The most needed in family life today is a unifying principle, a bond that will cement the members of a family together so tightly that disruptive agencies will lose their power. Natural ties are not strong enough; they can be overcome by natural forces. The truly unifying principle in the family must be supernatural."
"There exists such a supernatural, unifying principle, but it is sadly neglected. In fact, it is wholly unknown to many of those to whose privilege it is to apply it. How few persons there are that know anything about parental blessing. Perhaps you are the parent of children. Did you ever bless your children? "Our Lord used to gather little children around Himself and bless them. 'Suffer the little children to come unto me,' He said. 'And embracing them, and laying His hands upon them He blessed them.' Parents today love their children. They embrace them. Why do they not lay their hands upon them and bless them? Jesus wants children to be blessed."
"CERTAINLY THE blessing bestowed on children by Jesus was more efficacious than that which is bestowed on them by their parents. So also is the blessing imparted by a priest more efficacious than the parental blessing. Even so, the parental blessing is something so holy, so efficacious, that it deserves to be called the "Sacramental of the Domestic Hearth."
Although I realize that this pamphlet is available in any church and bookstore, I know from experience that there are many readers of this newspaper and this column who never have access to our pamphlet display; and I feel the thoughts outlined in this little book of mine are so justly my use of extensive

WHAT'S DOING AT THE DALY'S
The New Look In Fathers
By Mary Tinley Daly

American fathers of today are assuming a new role in family life, according to Dr. Arnold Gesell, founder of the Clinic of Child Development, Yale University School of Medicine, and now research consultant for the Gesell Institute of Child Development.
At a recent Mary Daly lecture in our town, Dr. Gesell said, "Father wants to know what makes little Johnny tick. By becoming interested in the mental cycles and patterns of the child, father is moving at last into what, up to this time, has been mainly mother's concern."
The sparking of father's interest in family life, Dr. Gesell believes, is important, "because the family is the most basic unit of our democratic culture."
Certainly father's "new" role is only a reinvigoration of the true position father always should have played—the place assigned him by Divine injunction—to be "Head of the House."
It is for a time, he accepted undisturbed status as "letting Mom have stage front center and take all the bows—that time is past.
Mom can do a good job—up to a point—but she can't do it alone. Bless her good-as-gold heart, she meets problems she can't cope with: faces up to a 14-year-old boy, for instance, who has "borrowed" a car—the police have another word for it—and tells him fearfully that "Nice people don't do that." Well, Sonny has no particular ambition to be "nice."
FATHER, SOMEBODY, can lay it on the line—tell Sonny, quite reasonably, how much investment the owner has in that car and for that investment has the right to use it whenever he sees fit. Anyone infringing on that right is a criminal, a thief.
Somewhat, the very bass tones of a masculine voice in serious discussion have a psychological ring of authority. The ever higher pitched tones of a woman in emotional stress produces an effect of hysteria.
It's a pity, but in this interregnum of American families, families who have been Mom-controlled up to a pivotal point know it's hard to shift authority. It can be done, though, and should be, as quickly as possible.
Young families, fortunately, have the advantage of fathers who have been indoctrinated in to the new-old look. These young men—fathers of very young children—have been caught up in the sensible wave of thought that permeates their day: that family life is of utmost importance and they must play a major role.
Moreover, this role is interesting and challenging, well worth their best effort. No longer is it considered sissy for a man to know how to make the baby's formula, care for the baby. Quite the opposite.
