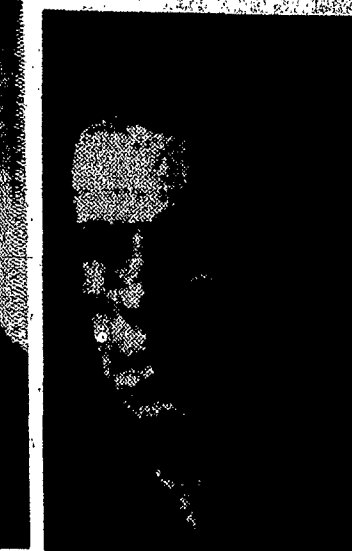

Summer Session Classes Set At Nazareth College

Nazareth College has announced its program for the Summer Session which will be held July 6 to August 13 inclusive. Classes will be offered in the elementary teacher education division, undergraduate courses, and graduate studies.

Registration will take place from 9 a.m. till noon and from 1 to 5 p.m. on Tuesday, July 6. Classes begin July 7 and final examinations are scheduled for August 12 and 13.

Following are the classes which are now scheduled, subject to change:

In the elementary teacher education division: Principles and Practices of Christian Social Living, Health Education, General Geography, Dramatic Art, American Civilization and Government, Tests and Measurements, Methods in Reading (all 3 credit courses); Kindergarten Practicum (6 credits); and Arts and Crafts (2 credits).

UNDERGRADUATE courses of instruction: College Algebra, French, English Drama, American History Since 1865, Introduction to Philosophy, American Literature, Government (3 credits); General Biology (6 credits); Business Mathematics, Physical Science (4 credits); Shakespeare, Teacher Relationships, History of the Christian Era, Principles and Practices of Guidance, Shorthand and Typing Methods, Marketing, Elementary School Voice Methods (Part II), Voice Culture I, Sight Singing and Dictation; Music Form and Analysis, Harmony I—Part I, Harmony II—Part II (2 credits).

Private lessons in voice, piano, violin or other instruments will also be offered.

Graduate courses of instruction: Contemporary Psychology of Learning (2 credits), Literary Criticism, Seventeenth Century Poets, Constitutional History, Europe Since 1814 and Music Literature (3 credits).

St. Rita's Parish Raises Over \$140,000 For School

A sum of \$140,188.95 was reported reached in the campaign of St. Rita's Parish, West Webster to build a new school and this sum will be increased, the Rev. Francis A. Kiehammer, pastor said today.

The campaign in an enthusiastic response to the appeal for school funds passed their \$85,000 goal by 168 percent. This assures breaking ground for the new West Webster parochial school by the end of the summer, the pastor said.

FATHER Kiehammer said he was most grateful to all workers and donors for the success of the drive.

"This could not have been done," he said, "without the 100 percent cooperation of parishioners and the spirit of self-sacrifice on the part of those who gave."

The campaign had the encouragement of both His Excellency Bishop Kearney and His Excellency Auxiliary Bishop Casey who spoke to the workers on the need for a Catholic school of their own.

IT IS PLANNED to build a school with nine classrooms with the possibility of two additional rooms and a cafeteria. The structure will be attached to the present Barn used for a hall by an open annex, and will face the rear of the church at an angle to Maple Drive and Ridge Road.

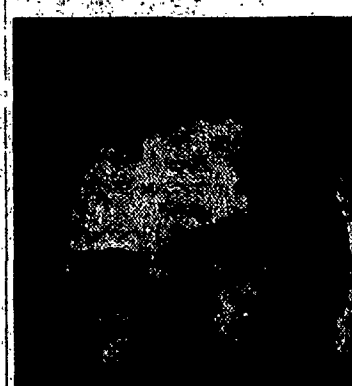
Father Kiehammer was honorary chairman of the drive with Thomas J. Kehoe of K&E-G Associates, Inc., campaign director.

Fr. Connolly Appointed To Provincial Post

Rev. James T. Connolly, C.S.S.R., former rector of St. Joseph's Church, Rochester, was appointed Provincial of the Redemptorist Province of the Redemptorist Fathers and will head the vice provinces of Richmond, Va., West Indies and Brazil. It was announced at St. Joseph's Rectory, Rochester, today.

Father Connolly came to Rochester as St. Joseph's Church rector in 1950. He was named Provincial-Consultor at Redemptorist Headquarters, East 74th St. in New York City in April of this year.

Prior to that he made a trip to Rome to act as "vocals" or representative of the Redemptorist Fathers in the Province and Vice Province over which he will now preside.

Ordained June 19, 1932, Father Connolly was in missionary work out of St. Alphonsus Church, New York City, served as an Army Chaplain in World War 2, was professor of St. Mary's College, North East, Pa., and for 20 years was professor of canon law and moral theology at St. Alphonsus-Seminary, Escopus.

Succeeding Father Connolly here is the Very Rev. Gerald J. Whelan, C.S.S.R.

Father Whitley attended Blessed Sacrament School and was graduated from Aquinas Institute in 1944. He entered St. Basil's Novitiate and made his first profession of vows on August fifteenth, 1945.

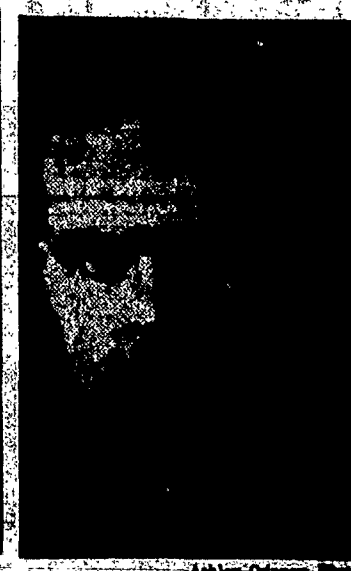
