### Young Catholics Forced To See Red Youth Rally

Berlin — (NC) — A considerable number of Catholic boys and girls were among the 400,000 young East German people who had to attend the annual Communist staged Whitsunday youth rally in the eastern sector of Berlin.

To help them meet their religious obligations, 20 special Masses were offered in the Catholic churches in eastern Berlin on Whitsunday and Monday, which is traditionally observed in many European countries as a big holiday. The Masses were particularly well attended on Monday.

The rally, an annual affair, was staged by the Communist controlled Free German Youth organization, the only one permitted to function in the eastern zone. Membership in this organization, while not compulsory, is practically essential to win scholarships, admission to universities and other advantages.
