

Franciscan Conference Set At Watkins Glen

"Mary in the Seraphic Order" will be the theme of the 35th annual meeting of the Franciscan Educational Conference at Padua High School in Watkins Glen from August 16 to 19.

Teachers from the various branches of the Franciscan Order will hear papers emphasizing the close association of the Order with the definition of the Immaculate Conception.

PAPERS WILL be offered by leading Franciscan scholars from throughout the U. S. outlining Franciscan devotion to Mary as it has existed throughout the centuries up to the current Marian Year.


Announcing the educational conference, Father Ignace Herscher, O.F.M., of St. Bonaventure University, said that special Franciscan attention to the Immaculate Conception can be traced to St. Francis himself when in 1219 it became the custom of the Franciscan Order to offer a Mass each Saturday in honor of the Immaculate Conception.

In 1923, under the generalship of St. Bonaventure, the order added the Feast of the Conception of Mary to its liturgy. Franciscan scholar John Duns Scotus more than 600 years ago gained the title "Marian Doctor" for his teachings on the Immaculate Conception.

In 1621 Mary Immaculate was chosen as patroness of the entire Franciscan Order. Father Ignace also reported that it was a Franciscan who, in 1807, placed before the Holy Father the petition for the solemn definition of the Immaculate Conception.

St. Anthony's Minor Seminary and Padua High School were established by the Franciscan Fathers of the Assumption Province, Pulaski, Wis., in August 1943 and dedicated in September of that year. The Franciscans bought the former Glen Springs hotel and remodeled it adding other buildings later.
