## John T. Nasser's Final Rites Held

Corning. The funeral of John T. Nasser of 145 E. First St., who died unexpectedly June 16, 1954, shortly after being admitted to Corning Hospital, was held June 19 with Solemn High Mass celebrated in St. Mary's Church at 9 a.m. followed by burial in St. Mary's Cemetery.

Debraut of the Mass was the Rev. Alfred J. Horn, assistant pastor of St. Mary's Church; the Rev. Thomas Brennan, pastor of the church; presiding at the ceremony, assisted by the Rev. Joseph Donovan, assistant pastor of St. Patrick's Church.

For Miss Father Brennan was deacon and the Rev. Lawrence Scammon, assistant pastor, was subdeacon. In the concelebration were the Rev. William Campari, pastor of St. Patrick's, and Father Donovan.

Mr. Nasser, a native of Lebanon and the son of Thomas and Mary Nasser, came to the United States in 1917. For many years he conducted a grocery business in Corning, retiring in 1950. He married, Mary David in 1908, who survives. He was a member of St. Mary's Church and its Holy Name Society.

Surviving are his widow and a daughter, Miss Mary Nasser at home; two sons, Dr. Thomas Nasser and Attorney Joseph Nasser, both of Corning; a granddaughter, Jennifer M. Nasser, two brothers, Samuel, of Syracuse and Shaker of Lebanon; a sister, Mrs. Lena Hitem of Syracuse and an uncle Joseph Neale, Sr. of Corning.

## Summer Session Of Classes Scheduled At St. Bonaventure

St. Bonaventure University will conduct a five-week summer session beginning Thursday, July 1, and ending Saturday, August 7, inclusive.

Registration for the summer session is scheduled for Thursday, July 15 in Butler Memorial Gym on campus. Hours are from 9 a.m. until noon and from 1 until 4 p.m. Classes will start July 2.

In announcing the summer session, Rev. Kevin Fox, O.F.M., St. Bonaventure registrar, said that courses will be offered on both graduate and undergraduate level.

Special attention has been given to courses in education, he said. These courses will provide an opportunity for teachers to continue "in-service" training. In addition, courses will be offered for those specializing in administrative, supervisory, guidance and personnel fields.

Courses in education available at the summer session will include: Administration of Secondary Schools; Seminar in Organization and Administration of the Physical Education Program; Principles of Guidance; Legal, Problems and Recent Legislation; Bibliography and Research in Education; and Measurement and Appraisal for Counselors.

For Sisters engaged in the teaching of religion, the cycle of theology courses will include: Dogmatic Theology; Moral Theology; Sacred Scripture; Church History; Canon Law; and Theological Sources.

## Polish Cardinal Reported Ailing

London (RNS)—Stefan Cardinal Wysyznski, Primate of Poland, is suffering from a serious illness, according to a source in Gniezno, where he is being cared for by nuns.

This was reported here by Polish emigrant government spokesman who said they had received the information from underground sources in Poland.

The report said that the Cardinal remains under strict house arrest and is closely watched by police officers.

The same sources also said that Polish Communist authorities had abandoned plans to bring Cardinal Wysyznski to trial on charges of espionage and anti-State activities. It was said the regime fears such a trial might incite Polish Catholics to open rebellions.
