## Bishop Casey Presents Diplomas To St. Joseph's Hospital Nursing Grads

His Excellency, Auxiliary Bishop Casey, presented diplomas and pins to the 28 graduates from St. Joseph's Hospital of Nursing, Elmira, on Monday, June 28, at St. Peter and Paul's Church. The class was presented by the Rev. Philip E. McMan, Chaplain.

Bishop Casey opened his address to the graduating class by commending the work of the medical and nursing staffs of the hospital. He said, "St. Joseph's Hospital enjoys an excellent reputation in medical circles and is remembered with gratitude by thousands of people. Protestants, Catholics, and Jews, who have had their ailments cured and have been set back on the road to health in this hospital."

He described nursing as a very high-class profession requiring "a great deal of charity and justice for success in those pursuing it. In advising the graduates, he said that he hoped the Divine

## Elmira Inmates Start Unique Devotion Soon

Inmates of the Elmira Reformatory are inaugurating a unique devotion to Our Blessed Mother which is believed to be the only one of its kind in the United States. The devotion called "Prison Knights of the Rosary" is being organized so that the rosary will be said continuously for the hours by the inmates during their leisure time in the cells.

The idea for this devotion is the result of the interest shown by the inmates in the Marian Year and of the "help and encouragement" given by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Francis J. Lane, Catholic chaplain at the reformatory.

The **Don Bosco Bulletin**, a religious publication at the reformatory states that too many people have the wrong impression of prisons and prison life—an impression "obtained from moving pictures about prison life and from stories written by newspapermen, etc., whose mainstay is sensationalism."

However, the bulletin states that: "These are days of rehabilitation, kindness, understanding, charity and benevolence. Many of the men in prisons all over the world have turned to God in their dark hours and spiritual void and remorsefulness."

"Now as you look into the cells, you are most apt to see inmates lingering at a prayer book, you won't see dark listless eyes, but eyes lit with hope and confidence in the future. Boys are in the process of becoming men, and men maturing."

The devotion will be organized with 30 men on a list. Each of the 28 will be given a particular time between 5 and 10 p.m. to say the Rosary—a feat there will always be someone saying it, when an inmate is paroled, a new man will be put in his place on the list.

## Ground Breaking For New Church Set On Feast Day

The church, which will occupy a large plot at Dodge Ave. and Elliott St., is estimated to cost about \$175,000, a substantial part of which has already been raised among the parishioners.

An evening Mass will be celebrated at 5:30 p.m. in St. Patrick's Church, Elmira on the First Friday (today) July 2.

Holy Communion will be distributed at the Mass and the law of fast requires that no solid food be taken for three hours prior to the Mass.

All liquids are forbidden for the same period of time, except water, which may be taken at any time.

The use of alcoholic beverages of any kind is not permitted from the previous midnight.
