Vacation School Slated For Ithaca Area Youth

Ithaca—More than 300 Catholic boys and girls attending public schools in Ithaca and its environs are participating in the 1954 session of Religious Vacation School, it was announced today by Rt. Rev. Msgr. William Byrne, pastor of Immaculate Conception Parish. This is the largest in the history of the parish A program conducted by the Mission Helpers of the Sacred Heart and six Lay Catechists—Mesdames Nell Bedell, Margaret Bennett, Caroline de Yaza, Elizabeth Hartsch, Ann Mahool and Clar Smith, is underway. The course followed is the "Confraternity Religion Course" written by the Mission Helpers of the Sacred Heart and a Committee of Sisters and printed by the National Office of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine, Washington, D.C. Opening exercises consist of morning prayers, salute to the cross and to the flag, followed by a doctrine period to correspond with the child's age level. Each morning after recess, one of a series of technicolor film strips, which simply and beautifully portray the articles of faith in the Apostles' Creed, is being shown. After a singing period conducted by the Sisters and Miss Patricia Mahool in which hymns and sacred music are taught, there is an instruction on the Mass. During the project period, the primary grades construct the primary grades construct home and picture cards to take home. The senior classes work out religious puzzles and anagrams, and do craft work. Rev. Paul A. Morgan, C.Y.O. director, is supervising Boys Athletics at recess time and Misses Joanne Smith, Virginia Wilcox, Phyllis Weber and Shirley Kippola are directing recreation in the playground. In addition to the other activities, the highlights of each week will be treasure hunts, when the names of 50 children will be drawn and given a choice of such prizes as statues, rosaries, plaques, holy water fountains and pictures. Two Crispell buses have been hired to transport 66 children from Fony Hollow, Newfield and West Hill, to the school at West Hill and at Longola in Baltimore and the Mission Helpers of the Sacred Heart and volunteer chauffeurs are driving children from the rural areas of Enfield Center, Mecklenburg, Brooktondale, Slaterville Springs, West Slaterville, Ellis Hollow, Snyder Hill, West

Navajo Wins Notre Dame Scholarship

The first Southwest Indian to win a scholarship to Notre Dame is William Upshaw, a Navajo whose Indian name is Red Fox. Unlike the majority of the members of his tribe struggling for an existence on their picturesque, desert with its purple mountains, vermilion cliffs, little vegetation, few schools and peak mortality rate, Red Fox attended school regularly and grew up to be a healthy lad.

His high school days were spent at St. Catherine's Indian School in Santa Fe. In his junior year he won a Marquette League scholarship award which brought him to New York for the summer as a guest of Father Cullen, director general of the League.

Impressed by Red Fox's integrity, industry, and intelligence, Father Cullen, upon the boy's graduation from high school, brought his record to the attention of Archbishop John F. O'Hara, C.S.C., Philadelphia and a former Notre Dame president. The scholarship followed.

Jesuit Assigned Sodality Post

The Rev. Francis K. Drolet, S.J. of New York has been appointed to the office of the Regional Sodality Secretary. In this capacity he succeeds the late Rev. Francis F. LeBuffe, S.J. who directed the Catholic Action movement for more than a quarter of a century.

The region entrusted to the new Sodality head covers all of New York State and in New Jersey the Archdiocese of Newark and the Diocese of Paterson. In this area there are estimated 3,000 Sodalities of Our Lady. Father Drolet is a native of Long Island, and attended parochial schools in Elmhurst and Corona. He graduated from Regis High School in Manhattan before entering the Jesuit Order in 1934. His studies were made at Woodstock College in Maryland and at the Institut-Ballmann in Belgium.

AS JESUIT TEACHER, he was an instructor in languages at the Jesuit Novitiate at Waverlyville and at Loyola in Baltimore and St. Peter's in Jersey City. At these latter schools, he also directed the students' Sodalities. In preparation for his present position, Father Drolet visited 11 European countries five years ago studying the Sodality movement. A considerable time was also spent at the International Sodality Secretariate in Rome, where he studied the documents which poured in from all parts of the world. On his return he was designated assistant to Father LeBuffe at the Regional Sodality Office.
