THEY WILL attend the Pontifical Gregorian University in the Eternal City.

Mr. Moynihan is the son of Captain Michael J. Moynihan of the Rochester Police Traffic Bureau and Mrs. Carolyn Horstman Moynihan, of 67 Wilmet St., Rochester.

In accordance with its annual custom, the club sponsored and served the breakfast for the First Communion class, and roses and prayer books were given to those who did not have them.

Cuba, O. (NC) — The advice of Mgr. Luigi G. Ligutti to younger men and youth is to work for "yourselves."

The executive director of the National Catholic Rural Life Conference incorporated this advice into his sermon at the annual Rural Life Day observance in the Diocese of Toledo.

Monsignor Ligutti preached at a Solemn Pontifical Field Mass offered by Toledo's Bishop George J. Keating, about 600 rural parishioners and their pastors assembled for the event that included a blessing of agricultural tools and seed and stock.

The Monsignor, praising the "independence" that goes with farming and its unselfish family possibilities, observed: "Too many young people do not hold up the idea of independence."


