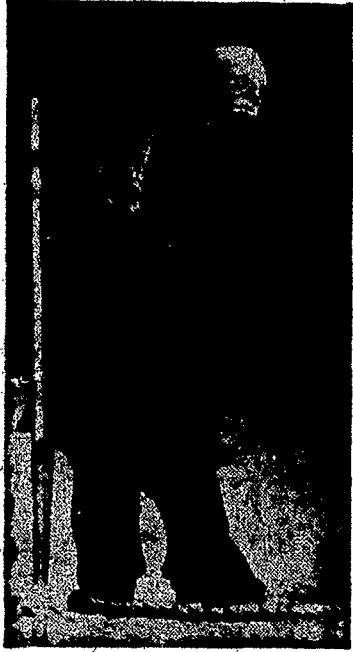

TV Stifles Culture, Says Father Lord

Cincinnati, O. — (NC) — Father Daniel A. Lord, S.J., famed youth leader and probably America's healthiest-looking cancer victim, last week called television "the most wonderful form of anesthesia ever invented."

In an interview at Xavier University, where he was scheduled to speak at a three-day institute for nuns attending the university summer sessions, Father Lord declared that in his opinion TV has "reduced young people's minds to a pulp."

Director of the Sodality of Our Lady for two decades and former editor of The Queen's Work, sodality magazine, Father Lord said, "My job for years was to stop kids from sitting and to get them moving — to get them out of the grandstands and on to the playing field." Now he sees the attractions of TV reducing them to inactivity again.

Francis J. Pilecki, President of the Student Board of Governors and Director of the Glee Club of St. John Fisher College has returned from the Fred Waring Summer Workshop which was held at Delaware Water Gap, Pa. high in the Poconos.

Pilecki was one of 138 music teachers from the continent who attended the workshop, to learn the Waring method of music education and concert production. He says of the workshop:

Blind Youth Attains High School Diploma Plans Law Career

New Orleans — (NC) — Lawrence Earl Fonton, who'll be 17 on August 14, came through with the proverbial flying colors and was awarded his diploma from Jesuit High School here.

Throughout his four years of high school, he maintained a general average of better than 85. In his course there were no deviations, no electives. Maybe there are plenty of average boys who attained a higher general average in high school. But Lawrence Earl Fonton isn't an average boy—you see, he can't. He has been blind since birth.

He came to Jesuit High School from John Dibert Public School, which has special classes for children who are blind or afflicted with poor sight. He was shown no special consideration during his high school studies. He was able to obtain some textbooks in Braille and for those he couldn't obtain, he had Braille copies made from books borrowed from other students. In many cases four large volumes in Braille represented one text book for the average student. He took his examinations orally in private.

Now with high school behind him, the ambitious blind boy plans to enter Loyola University of the South here in September to study law.
