Indonesia Teaching Post Is Destination Of Rochester Girl, Member of The Grail

A young Rochester teacher called this week from New York for the country once known as the exotic "Spice Islands," now the Republic of Indonesia. She is Miss Francine Wickes, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. F. C. Wickes of 115 Dearfield Drive, Rochester. Miss Wickes and her travelling companion, Miss Helen Fong, both staff members of the Grail, and graduates of Grailville Community College, are in leadership training at Loveland, Ohio.

"OUR DESTINATION is the modern city of Djakarta, capital of Western Java," Miss Wickes said before her departure. "Java itself is the largest of Indonesia's islands, with a population of some 50 million people—the most densely populated area in the world."

"In Djakarta, we will be met by Dr. Elizabeth Allard, Grail leader from Holland," Miss Wickes continued. "She has been working for a number of years in Indonesia, and now is engaged in sociological research at the University of Djakarta, where Helen and I will enroll. We expect to spend some time studying at the university in preparation for teaching work among the Javanese young women. Several other Grail members also are at work in Indonesia."

BESIDES HER work at Grailville Community College, Miss Wickes has just been graduated "cum laude" from Cincinnati's College of Music, where she finished a four-year degree course in just two years. She has had extensive experience in music, drama and rhythmic dance, both as a student and for the past several years as an instructor on the Grailville staff.

She took the leading part of Our Lady in a recent Marian Year production, which was worked out in rhythmic inter-

pretation and given by Grailville students before an overflow crowd in Cincinnati.

MISS WICKES attended Nazareth Academy in Rochester, and studied also in England and Switzerland.

Miss Wickes and Miss Fong expect to have a wide scope for their educational work when their studies are completed. "There are hundreds of women students in the cities of Western Java," Miss Wickes said. "We understand that they are women of great culture and refinement, eager to learn, with a real respect for their teachers."

Miss Fong is a native of Hong Kong. Besides Indonesia, Grail teams are engaged in medical, social, educational and cultural work in Africa: Kampala and Masaka in Uganda, Tankanyika, Belgian Congo, Basutoland and South Africa; Latin America: Brazil and Surinam; Pakistan and Hong Kong.

Father Malley Receives Doctorate Degree In Rome

Rev. Eugene R. Malley, C.S.B., a native of Rochester, received his doctorate in theology at the Angelicum, Rome, in June, according to The Canadian Register.

Son of the late Mr. and Mrs. James E. Malley, he was born in Rochester in 1924, attended Aquinas Institute before entering St. Basil's Novitiate in Rochester where he was professed on Oct. 10, 1943.

FATHER MALLEY attended St. Michael's College in Toronto where he received his bachelor of arts degree in 1948. In Sept. of that year he entered St. Basil's Seminary, and was ordained to the Holy Priesthood by His Eminence, James Charles Cardinal McGuigan in June of 1951. He offered his First Solemn Mass in St. Augustine's Church, Rochester on July 1, 1951.

After receiving his degree of master of arts in Spanish from the University of Toronto in 1952, Father Malley went to Rome to study Sacred Theology at the Angelicum while residing at the Canadian Pontifical College.
