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China Reds Expell 26 Missionaries
Hong Kong—(RNS)—Twenty-six Catholic foreign missionaries were expelled from Red China in June, Catholic headquarters here reported.
There are 137 still in the country, officials said. These include four bishops, four prefects apostolic, 78 priests and 51 nuns.
A returning Belgian priest said he had been put in a Peking cell with a Chinese priest, Father Harold W. Rigney, S.V.D., former rector of Peking's Fu Jen University.
The Belgian said both he and Father Rigney had been given a haircut, shave and bath in obvious preparation for expulsion. But Father Rigney was left behind, without explanation, when the Belgian was taken from the prison and sent to Hong Kong.
Father Rigney, a member of the Society of the Divine Word, was arrested by the Communists July 25, 1953, during a general round-up of missionaries.
Although he was later presumed to have died in prison, a Chinese nun reported in June, 1953, that she had seen a note signed by Father Rigney. The nun said his friends had verified the signature.

All-Out Atheistic Drive Planned In Hungary As Reds Abandon 'Leniency'

London—(NC)—A concentrated flood of atheistic propaganda may be expected in Red Hungary soon in a new drive to undermine the religious loyalty of the people, both Catholics and Protestants.

The new anti-religious campaign, according to well-informed sources here, is to be carried out under the auspices of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences, which recently held its annual meeting in Budapest.

THE MAIN SPEAKER was Premier Imre Nagy, who served clear warning that the policy of greater "leniency" toward the Catholic and Protestant Churches introduced last year under former Premier Matyas Rakosi is to be supplanted by a full-scale assault on the "religious prejudices" of the people.

"To get rid of deep-rooted dogmatism and abstract philosophy," he said, "there must be scientific criticism, widespread discussion of theoretical problems and an unrestricted contest of opinion."

What the Red leader actually meant was that while the government has no intention of permitting freedom of expression for any religious body—and especially not the Catholic Church—it is prepared to promote widespread anti-religious propaganda which none may dare challenge or try to answer.

Most of the discussions at the Academy of Sciences meeting was devoted to the problem of training "candidates" for the role of atheistic propagandists. These persons will lecture in villages and provincial centers on science, scientific truths, scientific explanations of natural phenomena, etc.—all these being the usual terms in Communist phraseology for spreading atheism.

THE ACADEMY will not only train and provide the personnel, but also the funds for the anti-religion offensive. It was announced at the general meeting that the academy's budget had risen from the equivalent of \$7,310,000 in 1950 to \$11,730,000 in 1954, and that a "considerable proportion" of this year's sum will be devoted to the atheistic propaganda drive.

Present at the academy meeting were five Soviet delegates

who helped to draw up the plan for training the agents who will carry on the campaign. Subsequently the Komsomolskaya Pravda, the official newspaper of Soviet youth, published an editorial in which it said: "It is necessary to fight actively against religious prejudices, primarily by means of scientific atheistic propaganda. Lectures and propagation of scientific knowledge are the basic methods of such propaganda."

IT IS THE apparent hope of the Budapest regime that the new anti-religion campaign will be in full swing in a matter of months and that it will make a real dent in the stubborn faith of devout Hungarians.

However, it requires to be seen whether the religious devotion of the Hungarian Catholics, which has become stronger rather than weaker the past year, will be seriously affected by the corps of godless lecturers now being indoctrinated for their mission.

All that is certain is that the regime is no longer content with its so-called leniency policy, begun after Joseph Cardinal Mindszenty and Archbishop Joseph Groz had been imprisoned and the rest of the hierarchy hampered in the exercise of their episcopal functions.

Under the policy adopted a year ago, government propagandists were instructed to impress on the people that "the Catholic Bishops have given into the regime." For this purpose, their most effective weapon was to quote the pastoral letters issued ostensibly by the Archbishops and Bishops, but drafted in the Communist Office for Religious Affairs.

THESE EFFORTS have not been without effect. Even many of the clergy have been disturbed and confused by the pastoral letter and instructions they have received from their archbishop or bishop's chancery office. However, in the main, the religious faith and loyalty of the Hungarian Catholics has remained staunch.

One of the best illustrations of this state of affairs is an anecdote told openly in the cafes of Budapest. According to the story, Matyas Rakosi, the Communist leader, having died, reaches the pearly gates where St. Peter welcomes him and tells him to take his seat in Paradise.

Rakosi has a look inside and then comes back shaking his head. "There must be a mistake," he tells St. Peter. "I can't be seated in a row above Cardinal Mindszenty." But St. Peter smiles pleasantly and replies: "No, no, my son, that is quite all right. You filled the churches of Hungary as they have never been filled before."

Summer Enrollment Heavy At CU

Washington—(NC)—The summer session of the Catholic University of America opened with a registration of 2,988—nearly as high as that of the winter session, and with the same high percentage of graduate students, according to Bishop Bryan J. McIntegart, rector.

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Prelate Praises Revolution Leader

Guatemala City—(NC)—Archbishop Mariano Russell of Guatemala City praised the "heroic and sincere" patriotism of Col. Carlos Castillo Armas, a Catholic and new Guatemalan president who led the recent revolution against the Reds.

In a message to Colonel Castillo, the prelate expressed his "welcome and fervent felicitations in the name of the country."

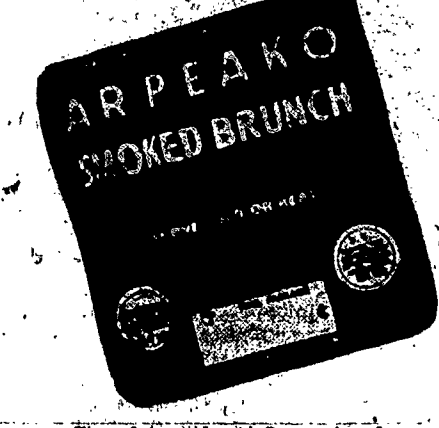
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
