

# Stone Church Designed By Architect For Corning Parish

## 350 Students Register For Summer Session

Three hundred and fifty students from communities in the Diocese of Rochester as well as from 10 states and Canada registered for the six weeks' summer session that marks Nazareth College's 24th year of service to religious and lay students.

The session which began July 6 and ends August 13 features offerings in the traditional liberal arts degree departments of Philosophy, English, History, Mathematics, French, Science, and in the special fields of business, education, and music. In the Elementary Teacher Training Division the Kindergarten Practicum continues to prove popular with sister-students.

MEMBERS OF the "kindergarten set" are invited to participate in this laboratory course in which are demonstrated procedures for successful teaching in the kindergarten situation. Serving New York State in its demand for qualified part-time school librarians, Nazareth College offers again, as it has in previous summer sessions, a three-summer sequence of library courses.

The library offerings include a course in school libraries and one in book selection. These courses form part of an 18-hour program available to religious and lay students and registered at the New York State Department of Education for in-service training credit for the teacher's certificate.

## Breaking Of Ground For New St. Vincent's Church, Rectory Slated On Feast, Monday

Corning — St. Vincent de Paul's parish will hold a formal ground breaking ceremony for its new church and rectory next Monday, July 19

at 10 a.m. The ceremony will be held at the site of the new church and rectory, which is now under construction on Dodge Avenue at Elliott Street.

The awarding of the contract to the Corning firm of Smith, Langhans & McLaughlin, which was low bidder at \$319,800.

The awarding of the contract was announced to the church congregation Sunday by the Rev. Joseph V. Guilfoyle, pastor.

Preparation of the site of the new church got under way this week. The ground breaking ceremony will be held on the site of the Feast of St. Vincent de Paul. Participating with the pastor will be the Rev. James F. Slattery, assistant pastor.

"At a meeting of the Diocesan Building Commission on Friday in the chancery in Rochester, bids of six contracting firms were formally opened and examined," Father Guilfoyle said. "After the examination of the bids, Arthur J. Bamann, a lay member of the Commission, moved that the contract be awarded to the lowest bidder, the firm of Smith, Langhans & McLaughlin of Corning. The motion was seconded by the Rev. Leslie G. Whalen, vice chancellor of the diocese and passed by the vote of the members present. We wish to congratulate the firm and we pray that God will bless their work."

THE \$319,800 amount of the bid includes the electrical, heating, and plumbing work, but excludes the furnishings of the church and rectory, as well as architectural fees.

The new church is to be of modified Gothic design. Father Guilfoyle announced. The exterior will be done in Lenox stone ("Cornell stone") quarried and cut near Ithaca. The interior will be finished in oak plywood paneling with supporting trusses and arches of laminated wood. Seating capacity is to be 600, which is expected to be adequate to care for future as well as

# New Superior General Named To Head Basilian Fathers

## Basilians Study Reuniting With French Order

The Very Rev. George B. Flahiff, C.S.B., has been named superior general of the Basilian Fathers, religious community of men who staff Rochester's Aquinas Institute and St. John Fisher College, at a general chapter meeting in Toronto, where plans were discussed for reuniting with the order's mother community in France.

The general chapter is composed of delegates from all houses of the community. Father Flahiff, who has been superior of the Pontifical Institute of Mediaeval Studies in Toronto for the past six years, was born in Paris, Ont. He graduated from St. Michael's College and entered the Congregation of St. Basil in 1926. After ordination in 1930, he went to France for graduate study and obtained his Diploma from the Ecole de Chartres.

ON HIS RETURN to Canada, he joined the staff of the Mediaeval Institute and the Graduate School of the University of Toronto. Father Flahiff succeeds the Very Rev. E. J. McCorkell, C.S.B., as superior general of the Basilian Fathers.

At the week long meeting, which elected members of a general council to serve for six years as well as a new superior general, delegates discussed the possibility of reuniting with the order's mother community in France. The North American community separated from the mother community in 1922. Now the French community, which has not flourished as well as the Sacred Congregation of Religious in Rome that the two unite. Union with the mother community in France is still pending, although the general chapter of the American community expressed favor of the action.

THE BASILIAN FATHERS were founded in 1522 at Annony, France, where the mother community still resides. The first Basilians came to America in 1850 at the invitation of Bishop de Charbonnel, first bishop of Toronto, who had been a student at Annony.

In 1852, St. Michael's College was founded in Toronto, and in 1870, Assumption College was taken over from the Jesuit Fathers, who founded the college in Windsor, Ont. in 1857.

First Novitiate of the Basilians in America was founded in Toronto in 1893, a second Novitiate was established in the Basilian residence on Augustine St., Rochester, in 1942. By 1900, establishment of two schools and a seminary were made in Texas.

The Rev. Donald E. Lux, pastor, spoke briefly and announced that Father Bush replaces the Rev. Henry Atwell who was recently named Assistant Editor of the Catholic Courier Journal. A testimonial gift was given to Father Atwell.

Monsignor Mahoney said that another meeting of the committee will take place September 9th and that details of the Rally will be published at that time.
