Milkmen Campaign To Raise Funds To Fight Sclerosis

Milkmen of the area have spent the past week in a drive to raise money for the study of multiple sclerosis by distributing campaign material on their routes. In addition to campaign literature explaining that multiple sclerosis is a crippling disease which attacks the covering of nerve fibers the milkmen delivered envelopes for contributions. Money collected will be divided between research, care of multiple sclerosis patients and support of the national organization. There are an estimated 400 victims of the disease in the Rochester area and 250,000 in the nation. Research on the disease is being conducted by 12 leading medical centers including the University of Rochester School of Medicine and Dentistry.
