Burial was in St. Mary's Cemetery with Father Ball, Father Nolan, Father Laughlin, Dr. Hogan, Father Carron, Father Hogan, and Father Hickey officiating.

The Geneva sailor was carried away despite rescue efforts of two other youths, Jerry Walters and James Brennan, but his body was later recovered.

A 1951 graduate of De Sales High School, he was graduated from Freeman Business School in 1952. He was employed in the office of the William E. McIntosh Co. frozen foods until enlisting in the Navy in Feb. 1953.

While in the Navy he received boat training and later attended Yeoman's School at the Bainbridge, Md., Naval Training Center before being assigned to the Bureau of Personnel at Arlington, Va. He visited his parents on a five-day leave during May.

Survivors in addition to his parents, include a brother, Coleman J. Connell, Seneca Falls; his maternal grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Patrick Murphy, 228 High St., his paternal grandmother, Mrs. Ella Connell, 57 N. Genesee St., and two nieces and a nephew.
